



ABOUT THE PROGRAM

1. Who is eligible to apply for the J-1 visa waiver program?

Foreign Medical Graduates who are in their final year of residency or fellowship in the US who hold a J-1 visa may apply.

2. What does the application process and timeline for the program look like?

Applications are accepted throughout the year on a first-come, first-served basis and can be submitted by the physician or their legal representative. The application period begins October 1 and ends September 30 of each year. **APPLY NOW**

3. How many applications does Nevada accept?

The program allows Nevada to sponsor 30 waiver applications per federal fiscal year, October through September.

4. What is the application fee for the Nevada Conrad 30 J-1 Visa Waiver Program?

For a non-profit organization, the cost is \$1,000 and for all others, \$2,000.

5. What are the eligible medical disciplines?

Physicians (MD) with a primary care discipline (Internal Medicine, Family or General Practice, Pediatrics, OB/GYN, or Psychiatry) and specialists, on a case-by-case basis.

BACKGROUND

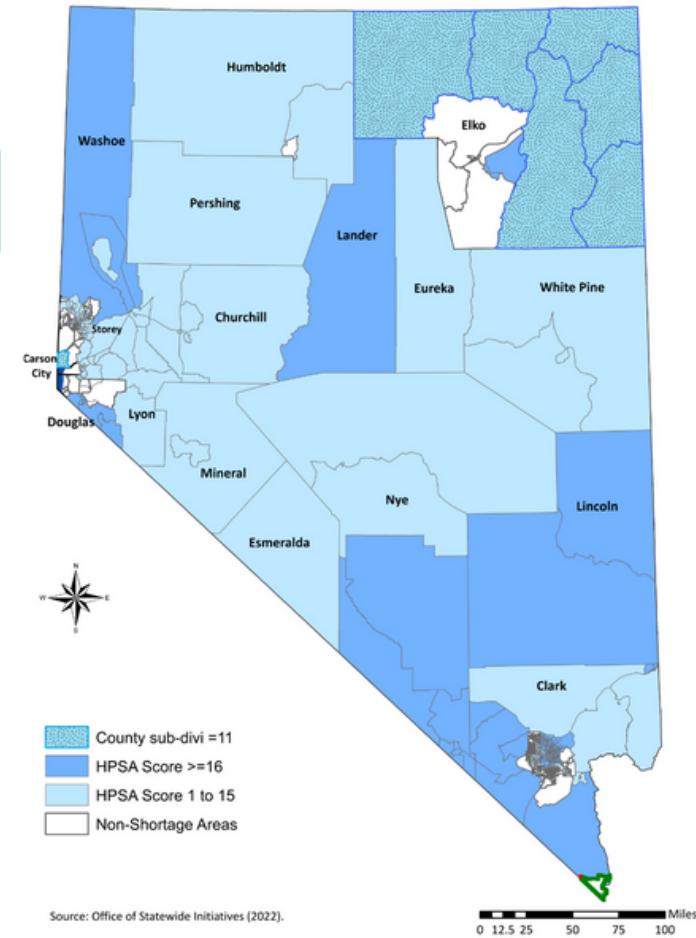
The Nevada Conrad 30 J-1 Visa Waiver Program agrees to waive the “two-year home country physical presence requirement” by sponsoring J-1 Physicians who agree to serve in federally designated shortage areas. The program addresses the shortage of qualified providers for the Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA), Medically Underserved Area (MUA), and Medically Underserved Population (MUP).
