Marla McDade Williams Receives Award from the Nevada Disability Advocacy \& Law Center (NDALC)

Carson City - The Health Division’s Deputy Administrator, Marla McDade Williams has been awarded the Lois Johnson Administrative Advocate award by NDALC. Williams will be presented with the award during the Advocacy Awards ceremony on June 24, 2010.

Williams is being honored for her work on the chemical restraint issues that occurred in southern Nevada and for improving the quality of care for people with mental illness. This honor has been awarded to three people previously and is named for Lois Johnson, a long time and respected NDALC employee who passed away in 2006.
