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INTRODUCTION

Priority health risk behaviors (i.e. preventable behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of morbidity and mortality) are often established during childhood and adolescence and extend into adulthood. Ongoing surveillance of youth risk behaviors is critical for the design, implementation, and evaluation of public health interventions to improve adolescent health. The Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) is a national surveillance system that was established in 1991 by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to monitor the prevalence of health risk behaviors among youth. The Nevada High School YRBS is a biennial, anonymous, and voluntary survey of students in 9th through 12th grade in regular public, charter, and alternative schools. The survey asks students to self-report their behaviors in six major areas of health that directly lead to morbidity and mortality, these include:

- 1) Behaviors that contribute to unintentional injuries and violence;
- 2) Sexual behaviors that contribute to human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection, other sexually transmitted diseases, and unintended pregnancy;
- 3) Tobacco use;
- 4) Alcohol and other drug use;
- 5) Unhealthy dietary behaviors; and
- 6) Physical inactivity.

In 2015, 32 high schools were randomly chosen by the CDC to represent Nevada. To ensure greater representation from schools in *all* districts, the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health contracted with the University of Nevada, Reno, School of Community Health Sciences to conduct the YRBS in all high schools throughout the state (100 schools, including the 32 high schools chosen by the CDC).

The 2015 Nevada High School YRBS provides statewide data to assess trends in priority health-risk behaviors among high school students; measure progress toward achieving national health objectives for *Healthy People 2020* and other program and policy indicators; and evaluate the impact of broad school and community interventions at the national, state, and local level. It is our intention that these data will be used by education and health professionals, policy makers, community members, and researchers to improve the health of Nevada's high schools students.

METHODS

Sampling, Weighting, and Analysis

The 2015 Nevada YRBS sampling plan was designed to ensure that every eligible student had an equal chance of selection. A two-stage (region and classroom) cluster sample design was used to produce a representative sample of students in grades 9–12 (all Nevada regular public, charter, and alternative high schools). In order to provide regional data that represent all counties in the state, the first sampling stage grouped all 17 school districts into 7 regions that generally reflect the substance abuse prevention coalition structure (Table 1). The regional grouping also helped ensure that individual schools could not be identified. In the second sampling stage, classes were selected

within schools with the probability based on a required margin of error in the sample size for each region. Intact classes of either all second period or all required English courses were randomly selected from each school. The questionnaire was administered to all students in sampled classes from February to May, 2015.

The 2015 Nevada YRBS data were weighted at the state level and regional level based on the sex, race/ethnicity, and grade level of students in each region. The weighting process ensured that the estimates accurately represent the entire student population in each region and the state as a whole. Non-response or poor sampling procedures can result in a sample that is not a representative subset of the population; therefore unweighted results from these samples may not accurately reflect student behaviors and could be misleading. This report only displays weighted results.


Permission Status and Response Rates


Parental permission is required for YRBS participation. Nevada school districts have two forms of parental permission: 1) active and 2) passive. Active parental permission means the students must return a signed permission form indicating their parent or guardian's approval for participation in the survey. Passive parental permission means the students take a permission form home and return it only if their parent or guardian does not want them to participate in the survey. The type of permission status varies by district based on school district policy. Active permission requires more time and resources and may reduce the number of students that participate in the survey. All school districts agreed to participate in the 2015 High School YRBS and only 3 schools did not participate (48 potential respondents). Overall, 5,108 youth from 97 schools completed the survey. While the overall response rates (a combination of school and

student participation) varied by school district, response rates were higher in the school districts with passive parental permission (Table 2 and Figure 1).

SUMMARY HIGHLIGHTS

Safety

- 21.4% of high school students rode in a car or other vehicle driven by someone who had been drinking alcohol during the past 30 days.
- 6.9% of high school students drove a car or other vehicle when they had been drinking alcohol during the past 30 days.
- 37.7% of high school students texted or emailed while driving a car or other vehicle during the past 30 days.

Violence-Related Behaviors

- 5.3% of high school students were involved in a physical fight on school property during the past 12 months.
- 6.7% of high school students were threatened or injured with a weapon on school property during the past 12 months.
- 18.5% of high school students were bullied on school property during the past 12 months.
- 13.8% of high school students were electronically bullied during the past 12 months.
- 7.6% of high school students did not go to school because they felt unsafe at school or on their way to or from school during the past 30 days.
- 9.9% of high school students experienced physical dating violence during the past 12 months.
- 11.2% of high school students experienced sexual dating violence during the past 12 months.
- 9.0% of high school students were ever physically forced to have sexual intercourse.
- 15.8% of high school students were ever physically abused by an adult.
- 16.4% of high school students ever witnessed physical domestic violence in their home.

Emotional Health

- 34.5% of high school students felt sad or hopeless for 2 or more weeks in a row during the past 12 months.
- 17.7% of high school students seriously considered attempting suicide during the past 12 months.
- 15.8% of high school students made a plan about how they would attempt suicide during the 12 months before the survey.
- 9.8% of high school students attempted suicide during the past 12 months.
- 21.5% of high school students did something to purposely hurt themselves without wanting to die during the past 12 months.
- 30.4% of high school students ever lived with someone who was depressed, mentally ill, or suicidal.

Tobacco Use

- 32.4% of high school students ever tried cigarette smoking.
- 7.2% of high school students smoked cigarettes during the past 30 days.
 12.1% of high school students under 18 who smoked during the past 30
 - days, obtained cigarettes by buying them in a store or gas station.

Electronic Vapor Products

- 50.9% of high school students ever used electronic vapor products.
- 26.1% of high school students used electronic vapor products during the past 30 days.

Alcohol Use

- 64.0% of high school students ever drank alcohol.
- 30.6% of high school student drank alcohol during the past 30 days.
- 15.3% of high school students participated in binge drinking during the past 30 days.

Marijuana and Other Drugs

- 39.4% of high school students ever used marijuana.
- 19.6% of high school students used marijuana during the past 30 days.
- 10.9% of high school students ever used synthetic marijuana.
- 16.9% of high school students ever took prescription drugs without a doctor's prescription.
- 9.0% of high school students took prescription drugs without a doctor's prescription during the past 30 days.
- 7.0% of high school students ever used ecstasy.
- 6.9% of high school students ever used inhalants.
- 29.2% of high school students were offered, sold, or given an illegal drug by someone on school property during the past 12 months.
- 30.4% of high school students ever lived with someone who was a problem drinker, alcoholic, or abused street or prescription drugs.

Sexual Behaviors

- 38.5% of high school students ever had sexual intercourse.
- 10.5% of high school students ever had sexual intercourse with four or more persons.
- 27.1% of high school students were sexually active during the three months before the survey.
 - Among the 27.1% of high school students who were sexually active, 56.9% used a condom during their last sexual intercourse.
 - Among the 27.1% of high school students who were sexually active, 20.4% used alcohol or drugs before their last sexual intercourse.
- 85.6% of high school students self-identified as heterosexual, 2.9% as gay or lesbian, 7.0% as bisexual and 4.5% were not sure.
- 10.7% of high school students had ever been tested for HIV.

Diet

- 5.0% of high school students did not eat fruit or drank 100% fruit juices one or more times per day during the past 7 days.
- 6.7% of high school students did not eat vegetables one or more times per day during the past 7 days.
- 22.7% of high school students did not drink one or more glasses of milk per day during the past 7 days.
- 14.5% of high school students drank soda or pop one or more times per day during the past 7 days.
- 16.7% of high school students did not eat breakfast on any of the past 7 days.
- 4.0% of high school students most of the time or always go hungry because there is not enough food in the house and 11.2% of high school students sometimes go hungry because there is not enough food in the house.

Physical Activity

- 13.9% of high school students were not physically active at least 60 minutes on any day during the past 7 days.
- 38.3% of high school students played video or computer games or used a computer for three or more hours per day on an average school day.
- 22.9% of high school students watched television three or more hours per day on an average school day.
- 54.4% of high school students attend physical education (PE) classes on one or more days in an average week when they were in school.
- 77.5% of high school students got less than 8 hours of sleep on an average school night.

Weight

- 11.4% of high school students were obese.
- 15.8% of high school students were overweight.
- 48.1% of high school students were trying to lose weight.

Resilience

- 77.5% of high school student had parents or other adults who mostly or always asked where they would be going or who they would be with.
- 62.7% of high school students said they had friends and 32.6% said they had a parent or other family member they felt comfortable talking to about important life questions.
