This was done to improve the Division's efforts to ensure a transparent, open and competitive process in compliance with federal and state regulations. This also works to support those community partners that have been working to address the impacts of COVID-19 and for applicants to be able to respond to the new grant application.

DPBH encourages new applicants to apply, particularly those who target vulnerable and at-risk communities to improve access to care.

As a reminder, pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 333.155, any person or agency who is considering or will be submitting an application in response to this NOFA, or representative thereof, must not contact any representative of the Division with questions regarding the NOFA. All questions must be submitted through the individual identified above.

Answers to the questions will be posted on or before Tuesday, June 16, 2020. The first round of responses to the questions were posted below the grant announcement.

CLARIFICATION

The SAPTA application is focused on the SAPTA Block Grant Funds, State Opioid Response (SOR) funding, and may be used for future funding that is made available for SAPTA services through other federal grant applications. Since this is a multi-funding opportunity, all applications

will be reviewed for each available funding source, as appropriate and allowable by the Code of Federal Regulations and the federal grant award restriction of activities based on application completeness, services and rankings by an evaluation committee.

Applicants should be aware that the DPBH no longer has State Targeted Response (STR) funds. Any applicant who was previously funded by STR funds, and requesting a continuation of activities, should be focused on State Opioid Response (SOR) funding, or if appropriate and allowable, SAPTA Block Grant funds.

For those applying for consideration of SOR funding only, services may include prevention, treatment, and/or recovery services. Applicants should define the target populations as appropriate, with the category of community-based services.

There is no guarantee any previous applicants will be awarded funds or that grant awards will be made at the amounts requested or previously awarded. This is an open and competitive funding opportunity. DPBH reserves the right to work with an agency, whose application ranks high enough to request additional information or modifications to meet the intent and requirements of the funding.
