The following are the bills that will affect medical laboratory statutes and regulations.

AB 239 (approved by Assembly and Senate): Stated in section 13, this bill was introduced by the legislative Sunset Committee who were reviewing Nevada statutes that could be sunset (removed) due to the statute seeming not to be active or had no funding to support it. The statutes being reviewed by the Sunset Committee relating to Medical Laboratories were Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 652.160 and 652.170. These two statutes address the Medical Laboratory Advisory Committee (MLAC). Until 2022, the MLAC committee had not convened for a meeting since 2016. The updates to this statute include: 1) if a vacancy occurs in the Advisory Committee, the Committee shall submit a letter to the Nevada Board of Health with a recommendation to fill the vacancy; and 2) the Advisory Committee shall meet at least once per year and at least once per year, determine whether any vacancy in the Advisory Committee exists.

AB 432 (delivered to Governor): Stated in section 29, AB 432 will allow for licensed optometrists to be laboratory directors of laboratories in which Waived laboratory tests can be performed. The statute NRS 652.210(1) currently allows for a licensed optometrist to collect specimens and perform Waived laboratory testing, but this bill will allow for them to be a laboratory director of a Waived (Exempt) laboratory. A change to NAC 652.397(1) will need to be addressed to add a licensed optometrist to be qualified laboratory directors of Waived (Exempt) laboratories.

AB 503 (approved by Assembly, stalled in Senate): In its original form, sections 70 through 77 of AB 503 would have required fingerprints from any owner (or if the owner is a corporation, each officer, director and beneficial owner of 10 percent or more of its shares) and laboratory director applying to operate, conduct testing, issue a report, or maintain a medical laboratory, in Nevada. An amendment adopted by the Assembly Committee on Commerce and Labor removed those sections from the bill, which then passed both the full Assembly and the Senate Commerce and Labor Committee, but it never made it to a vote by the full Senate.

<u>SB 201 (stalled in Senate)</u>: Stated in multiple sections of the bill, SB 201 would have allowed for licensed pharmacists to order Waived laboratory tests that are necessary for therapy that uses a drug that has been approved by the FDA. The bill also stipulated that the pharmacist can be the laboratory director of a laboratory which performs Waived laboratory testing. In a separate statute, a pharmacist cannot order a test unless they have a collaborative agreement with an authorized medical provider (MD, DO, PA, APRN). In addition, according to NAC 652.397, a





pharmacist can only be a laboratory director if the only test performed is a fingerstick glucose test. The Senate Commerce and Labor Committee approved Amendment 400, which added further language of, "within the authorized scope of practice of the registered pharmacist," but SB 201 was never heard by the full Senate.
