SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT 2023 PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO NAC CHAPTER 458

The Division of Public and Behavioral Health (DPBH) has determined that the proposed amendments should not have a negative economic impact upon a small business or inhibit the formation, operation or expansion of a small business in Nevada.

A small business is defined in Nevada Revised Statutes NRS 233B as a "business conducted for profit which employs fewer than 150 full-time or part-time employees."

This small business impact statement is made pursuant to NRS 233B.0608 (3) and complies with the requirements of NRS 233B.0609. As required by NRS 233B.0608(3), this statement identifies the methods used by the agency in determining the impact of the proposed regulation on a small business in sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 below and provides the reasons for the conclusions of the agency in section 8 below followed by the certification by the person responsible for the agency.

Background

The proposed regulations are being moved forward to increase efficiencies by reducing redundant regulations. The Division doesn't currently have the statutory authority to obtain criminal background checks. The intent is to honor the background check that the agency completed for the detoxification technician, with a statement certifying that the individual does not have a disqualifying conviction on their record. This will allow for a more streamlined process for certifying detoxification technicians.

1) A description of the manner in which comment was solicited from affected small businesses, a summary of their response and an explanation of the manner in which other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

Pursuant to NRS 233B.0608 (2)(a), the Division of Public and Behavioral Health has requested input from small businesses that may be impacted by this proposed regulation change.

A Small Business Impact Questionnaire was sent to various listservs through the Division along with a copy of the proposed regulation changes, on March 22, 2023. The questions on the questionnaire were:

- 1) How many employees are currently employed by your business?
- 2) Will a specific regulation have an adverse economic effect upon your business?
- 3) Will the regulation(s) have any beneficial effect upon your business?
- 4) Do you anticipate any indirect adverse effects upon your business?
- 5) Do you anticipate any indirect beneficial effects upon your business?

2) Describe the manner in which the analysis was conducted.

The Division dispersed the small business impact questionnaire to 9,053 individuals through listservs maintained by the Division. Only one questionnaire was returned.

3) The estimated economic effect of the proposed regulation on the small business which it is to regulate including, without limitation both adverse and beneficial effects and both direct and indirect effects.

The Division believes the removal of this language will assist with streamlining the requirements for an agency to utilize the background check for a detoxification technician that was already completed upon hire of the individual, while also certifying that the person does not have a disqualifying conviction. Although this language is outlined in regulation, the Division doesn't have the authority in Statutes to obtain background checks, so this language isn't enforceable.

4) Provide a description of the methods that the agency considered to reduce the impact of the proposed regulation on small businesses and a statement regarding whether the agency actually used any of those methods.

The Division of Public and Behavioral Health has held several opportunities for small businesses and the public to provide input and comments regarding the proposed regulations, including the economic impact the proposed regulations may have on their business. Modifications to the proposed regulations have been made as a result of this input. Workshops will be held on April 21, 2023 allowing for further input by the community regarding the proposed regulations and how they will impact them. These comments will be taken into consideration for possible further revisions to the regulations to reduce the economic impact on facilities.
