
ATAP Caseload

Monthly caseload for February 2024

- 105 new applications
- 1,042 active children, average age: 8.7 years old
- 38 total inactive children:
 - 31 Straight ATAP Average age of 4.9 years old
 - 7 Service Coordination
- Average wait time for all ATAP children (days from application start date to the date the child drops or becomes active):
 - 39 Days



ATAP Caseload Growth




The chart above demonstrates the active caseload and waitlist averages over time. These numbers are derived from the CLEO report.


Waitlist Elimination Progress

Trend in Total Wait Time




The graph above demonstrates the average number of days waiting for children who are "Pending" or "In Process" to become either "Active" or "Dropped" in the program.

** Please note, no new referrals are included in these averages, a change from previous presentations.






The graph above demonstrates the average number of days waiting for children from "Pending" until they are "In Process".

Trend in Total Wait Time (Eligible to Active)




The graph above demonstrates the average number of days waiting for children from "In Process" to become either "Active" or "Dropped" in the program.

*Wait time average includes all time child spent from Pending start date until they were either Dropped or went Active.

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


New Referrals



The chart above demonstrates the number of new referrals entering the ATAP system.






This chart shows the comparison between Straight ATAP and Medicaid Caseload (Service Coordination).
