

MCHAB Update – August 12, 2016

MCH Block Grant Domains, Priority Needs, and Activities (Evidence-based/informed strategies to be added later):

- **Domain: Women/Maternal Health**
 - Priority Objective #1: Annual 2% increase of women 15-44 receiving routine check-ups in the last year
 - Activity (education, collaboration and training)
 - **Title V/MCH –**
 - Developing collaborations with community partners, especially health districts, to increase capacity in this area
 - **Rape Prevention & Education (RPE) Program –**
 - 45 attendees at November 2015 Health Conference on the topic of *“Teen Relationship Abuse; A Public Health Priority”*
 - 19 attendees participated in the first quarter of 2016 on the topic of *“Teen Relationship Abuse; A Public Health Priority”*
 - In February of 2016 the RPE program designated a new Sexual Assault Coalition for Nevada. Nevada Network Against Domestic Violence will be the dual agency (domestic and sexual violence) tasked with providing training for community partners, among other duties
 - **MCH Coalition (north, south and statewide) –**
 - Statewide Spring Symposium was held June 1st both in Las Vegas and Reno with topic of Addressing Health Disparities
 - WC FIMR CAT & Northern Nevada MCH Coalition is using the *“Go Before You Show”* Campaign to encourage women to access prenatal care before 12 weeks gestation (additional funding still needed)
 - Southern Nevada Coalition will address well women visits through outreach and education to other organizations who service women of childbearing age & promotion of Nurse Family Partnership and Healthy Start Programs
 - **Home Visiting –**
 - All funded agencies are providing home visits, with service capacity up 79 slots for a total enrollment of 309 families
 - **Primary Care Office –**
 - Work with partners to improve access and availability of healthcare services in underserved areas and for underserved populations
 - Collaborate with partners in Elko to expand obstetrical services in Northeastern area of Nevada

- A new multi-county primary care HPSA designation is being proposed for Churchill, Lyon, Mineral and Pershing Counties to reflect patterns of care seeking and service delivery in this region
- Staff presented multiple reports to the Legislative Health Committee including an update on the *Behavioral Health Pipeline Mapping project*, an overview of recruitment and retention programs in collaboration with multiple partners, and an overview of licensing board survey responses. Research and analysis are underway for a related bill draft request
- Application was reviewed, public hearing was held, and letter of approval for Certificate of Need was awarded to Banner Churchill Community Hospital in June, for expansion of their Emergency Department to increase access and quality of care

- Priority Objective #2: Increase in the percentage of women receiving prenatal care in first trimester
 - Activity (training for healthcare providers)
 - **Title V/MCH –**
 - Developing collaborations with community partners, especially health districts, to increase capacity in this area
 - **Primary Care Office –**
 - Support primary care workforce development through linkages with education and training, licensure and certification, and recruitment and retention
 - Collaborate to Improve Birth Outcomes, including updated goals and objectives and strategies to improve access to health care: telehealth expansion is a key strategy

- **Domain: Perinatal/Infant Health**
 - Priority Objective #1: Increase percentage children ever breastfed
 - Activity (community meetings/workshops and training)
 - **Title V/MCH –**
 - Developing collaborations with community partners, especially health districts, to increase capacity in this area
 - **MCH Coalition (north, south and statewide) –**
 - Statewide Spring Symposium was held June 1st both in Las Vegas and Reno with topic of Perinatal Mood and Anxiety Disorders
 - Northern Nevada Coalition presentation on Kangaroo Care, Public screening of MILK documentary
 - **Maternal-Infant Program –**
 - Distribute materials to promote Text4Baby

- Work with Breastfeeding Coalition on Liquid Gold 5K & Latch-on Event August 6
 - Ongoing meetings with public and private partners regarding Safe Sleep messaging, including upcoming public awareness campaign
- Priority Objective #2: Increase percent children breastfed exclusively at 6 months
 - Activity (community meetings/workshops and training)
 - **MCH Coalition (north, south and statewide) –**
 - Statewide Spring Symposium was held June 1st both in Las Vegas and Reno with topic of Advancing Breastfeeding Policies in Practices in Nevada: Charting the Way Forward
- Priority Objective #3: Increase the number of baby-friendly hospitals
 - Activity (community meetings/workshops and training)
 - **Maternal-Infant Program**
 - In August three hospitals will receive banners for meeting the criteria for being baby-friendly (5% or less of elective delivery)
 - MCH continues to collaborate with the March of Dimes and Nevada Hospital Association to inform hospital of the requirements and advocate for the hospital to work toward designation
- **Domain: Child & Adolescent Health**
 - Priority Objective #1: Increase percentage children who received a developmental screening using a parent-completed screening tool
 - Activity (Collaboration, community meetings/workshops, educational campaign and training)
 - **Title V/MCH –**
 - Developing collaborations with community partners, especially health districts, to increase capacity in this area
 - **MCH Coalition (north, south and statewide) –**
 - Statewide Spring Symposium was held June 1st both in Las Vegas and Reno with topic of ASQ & ASQ-Se Screening Efforts of the Children’s Cabinet
 - **Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCN) program –**
 - conference call with Children’s Cabinet & Part C (discussion on ASQs and Enterprise Data system)

- Priority Objective #2: Increase percent children who have been screened for Autism Spectrum Disorder
 - Activity (Collaboration, community meetings/workshops, educational campaign and training)
 - **No Activity through programs at this point**

- Priority Objective #3: Increase the percent of high school students who are physically active at least 60 minutes a day for 5 or more days a week
 - Activity (Collaboration, community meetings/workshops, educational campaign and training)
 - **School Health Program –**
 - Completed the Comprehensive School Physical Activity Program (CSPAP) training of trainers (TOT) to provide professional development to school staff in Nevada. A total of ten professional development sessions on CSPAP have been offered between April and June 2016 in Clark, Washoe, Elko, Douglas and Lyon County School Districts
 - A Nevada CSPAP webpage located at NVCSAP.org within Nevadawellness.org was developed to provide resources for implementing CSPAP and additional training sessions within their county and online
 - A sustainability plan has been established by the School Health Coordinator and CSPAP trainers to continue providing trainings and support

- Priority Objective #4: Increase the percent of high school students who attend physical education classes on 1 or more days a week
 - Activity (Collaboration, community meetings/workshops, educational campaign and training)

- Priority Objective #5: Increase the percent of adolescents aged 12-17 with a preventive medical visit in the past year
 - Activity (Collaboration, community meetings/workshops, educational campaign and training)
 - **Title V/MCH –**
 - Developing collaborations with community partners, especially health districts, to increase capacity in this area
 - **Adolescent Health and Wellness Program –**
 - Assisted with Strategic Plan to increase yearly well-care visits for youth ages 15 – 18 whom are uninsured by expanding access to coverage and services

- Networked with State Adolescent Health Coordinators across the country working on expanding adolescent well-visits. Interactions focused on issues such as: youth engagement activities; system building strategies; methods of communication to build support for adolescent youth internally and externally, etc.
- Enhanced service delivery at three high school School-Based Health Centers
- Collaborated with Action for Healthy Kids to provide training to Clark and Washoe County School District's in April and May 2016 on implementing their local school wellness policy. The training also covered incorporating physical activity and nutrition scenarios where best practices should be used including Smart Snack Standards in schools
- School districts reported their annual progress of implementing the local school wellness policy including physical activity and nutrition goals in June 2016 to the Nevada Department of Agriculture

Priority Objective #6: Increase the percent of PREP and Abstinence program participants that received education on well visits

- Activity (Collaboration, community meetings/workshops, educational campaign and training)
 - **PREP/AEGP Program –**
 - State personnel attended 2016 HHS Teen Pregnancy Prevention Grantee Conference – Connecting the Dots: Collaborating to Achieve Lasting Impacts for Youth
 - Received aggregate program data from 2014-2015 indicating PREP served 555 youth reporting the following due to knowledge gained from the program (except first bullet):
 - 42% had ever had sex (question on entry survey)
 - 63% were less likely to have sex in the next 6 months
 - 57% were more likely to abstain from sex in the next 6 months
 - 82% were more likely to use a condom
 - 72% were more likely to use birth control
- Priority Objective #7: Increase the percent of applicable Medicaid participant well visits in FFS and ACOs
 - Activity (Collect data information from Medicaid per MOA)
 - **No Activity through programs at this point**

- **Domain: Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCN)**
 - Priority Objective #1: Increase percentage of children with a medical home in the past year
 - Activity (Educational campaign and collaboration)
 - **Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCN) program –**
 - Data collection for Critical Congenital Heart Disease (CCHD), contacted hospitals that were missing data since January 2016
 - Priority Objective #2: Increase percent of state and community partners that received education on the medical home
 - Activity (Educational campaign and collaboration)
 - **MCH Coalition (north, south and statewide) –**
 - Family Ties presentation to the Northern Nevada Coalition (May 2016)
 - Priority Objective #3: Increase the number of referrals to Nevada’s medical home portal
 - Activity (Educational campaign and collaboration)
 - **No Activity through programs at this point**
- **Domain: Cross-Cutting/Lifecourse**
 - Priority Objective #1: Decrease girls and women smoking in pregnancy
 - Activity (promote Quitline, partner/collaborate across state programs and community partners, provide educational materials, provide training, expand knowledge and conduct educational campaign)
 - **Title V/MCH –**
 - Developing collaborations with community partners, especially health districts, to increase capacity in this area
 - **MCH Coalition (north, south and statewide) –**
 - Statewide Spring Symposium was held June 1st both in Las Vegas and Reno with topic of Tobacco and Adolescents
 - Priority Objective #2: Decrease girls and women smoking during offspring’s childhood
 - Activity (promote Quitline, partner/collaborate across state programs and community partners, provide educational materials, provide training, expand knowledge and conduct educational campaign)
 - **Maternal-Infant Program –**

 - Distribute materials to health districts and healthcare providers regarding smoking
 - Working with community partners to improve birth outcomes related to smoking
- Priority Objective #3: Increase the number of Medicaid participants with smoking cessation counseling
 - Activity (Collect data information from Medicaid per MOA)
 - **Maternal-Infant Program –**
 - Working with community partners to improve birth outcomes related to smoking
 - Priority Objective #4: Increase local and statewide programs integrating insurance importance and accessibility messaging to develop or target promotion of insurance (e.g., Nevada Check-up and Nevada Health Link)
 - Activity (track and analyze Medicaid data, develop and post educational information, and have community programs conduct outreach)
 - **Title V/MCH –**
 - Developing collaborations with community partners, especially health districts, to increase capacity in this area
 - **Adolescent Health and Wellness –**
 - Working within a state team to develop concrete activities, and partners needed, to ensure access to coverage and healthcare for adolescents 15-18
 - Priority Objective #5: Increase number of Medicaid enrollees with children
 - Activity (track and analyze Medicaid data, develop and post educational information, and have community programs conduct outreach)
 - **No Activity through programs at this point**
