

- Have you rejected clients who sought your care because you are not covered by their insurance?


Have you been rejected by a Nevada insurer?




How many insurers have you been rejected by?

Survey Comments to Q4

- Again, with an asterisk, it is only because we host graduate practicum students that we do not turn away clients. Some insurance plans simply don't pay enough to cover overhead and that is why we are not in network. I could go on, but this gives a clear enough picture.
- If they want to use their insurance and are not open to cash pay, which happens frequently (at least 1-2 per week) I have to refer out. Otherwise I will see them for a cash rate and often even offer a sliding scale when they cannot get into anyone on their insurance panel because those clinicians are not accepting new clients.
