- The Social Security Act has provided funding for the Title V MCH Block Grant, administered by the Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) since 1935
- Title V funds are distributed to grantees from 59 states and jurisdictions. This funding supports:
 - Access to quality health care for mothers and children, especially for people with low incomes and/or limited availability of care
 - Health promotion efforts that seek to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of preventable diseases
 - Access to comprehensive prenatal and postnatal care
 - Access to preventive and childcare services
 - Family-centered, community-based systems of coordinated care for children with special healthcare needs



Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCN) Program



The CYSHCN Program:

- provides resources and support to community agencies serving children from birth to age 21
- provides population health services focused on funding community programs
- bridges service/referral gaps, linking families to appropriate resources and providers
- develops strategies to better serve children and families through a systems framework of federal, state, local community and family-based partners



Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs: Nevada Program



The CYSHCN Program (NV):

- Oversees the Nevada Medical Home Portal to improve children's care coordination in Nevada
- Manages the Critical Congenital Heart Disease (CCHD) Registry to screen newborns and collect data on CCHD
- The CYSHCN Program also collaborates with funded partners





State Accountability



- To demonstrate the impacts of Title V on selected health outcomes,
 Title V states utilize a three-tiered performance framework:
 - National Outcome Measures (NOMs) represent the desired result of Title V
 program activities and interventions. These measures for improved health
 are longer-term
 - National Performance Measures (NPMs) are intended to drive improved outcomes relative to one or more indicators of health status (i.e. NOMs) for the MCH population
 - Evidence Based Strategy Measures (ESMs) are intended to hold states accountable for improving quality and performance related to the NPMs and related public health issues. They help more directly measure the impact of specific strategies on the NPMs



Medical Home Portal





- Medical Home Portal (MHP) was in early 2017 by University of Utah Department of Pediatrics (UUDP)
- MHP provides information, resollocal referrals to families, service and care coordinators serving C'
 - Over 4,000 local and national se providers in the Nevada director

Medical Home Portal Cont.



- Nevada 2-1-1 serves as the source of referral information for community and professional service providers serving the CYSHCN population
- Data from Nevada 2-1-1 is exported to UUDP quarterly
- UUDP makes data available to the CYSHCN Program Coordinator
 - Also improve MHP site (new features, reorganization, etc.)
- CYSHCN Program Coordinator prepares data for presentation on MHP
 - Chooses what referral information to upload and how its categorized
 - Cleans the data, if necessary (duplication, incorrect listings, etc.)


