<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Learn from families at Booth and Veterans Elementary School to better understand utilization of existing resources.</li> <li>2) Engaging interested families from the selected schools, convene workgroups of families to help improve food security through schools.</li> <li>3) Increase food pantry, WIC &amp; SNAP utilization at Booth, Veterans and for eligible families.</li> <li>4) Improve Kids Café to allow parents to eat with their children. This could be accomplished through policy changes, additional funding sources, or both.</li> <li>5) Support health care entities working on screening for Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) including food insecurity.</li> <li>6) Support comprehensive Nutrition Education (to include how to budget, use and eat unfamiliar healthy food).</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) All qualifying (K-3) children at Booth and Veterans Elementary Schools have Nevada College Savings Plan.</li> <li>2) Provide training and supports for Washoe County under/un-employed families of WCSD students to acquire in-demand skills for today's jobs (the new Nevada) and get them on a pathway/employed in living wage positions.</li> <li>3) Increase community awareness of employment and training opportunities to promote pathways (resources) to success.</li> <li>4) Establish/offer Getting Ahead groups at Libby Booth and/or Veterans Elementary Schools.</li> <li>5) Assist families to establish at least \$300 in savings for emergency; targeting rent burdened families at Libby Booth and Veterans.</li> <li>6) Support literacy through 30 books in the home through partnerships.</li> <li>7) Partner, educate support parents/surrogates reading with children.</li> <li>8) Celebrate, set new goals.</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Work with CT7 community members and stakeholders to improve the affordability and condition of housing.</li> <li>2) Work with Silver State Fair Housing, Washoe Senior Law Project, Washoe Legal Services and Nevada Legal Services to assist with education, legal support and advocacy related to fair housing.</li> <li>3) Extend/expand individual and community resources and capacity to create safe, affordable and healthy housing/homes for every person.</li> <li>4) Work with CT7 community members and stakeholders to address at least one of the housing needs identified through the outreach sessions.</li> <li>5) Work with community, organizations (e.g., Reno Housing Authority) and state and local policy makers to improve supply, affordability and stability of housing in CT 7 and beyond (e.g., safe multi-family policy, rent caps/control, other incentives).</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Establish permanent supportive housing (PSH) for 110% of youth and families in CT 7 (~113-125) by December 2018.               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a.
