# Rural Mobile Health Clinic and Medical Miles for Rural Smiles



From April 9-June 30, 2018, the Southern Nevada Health District in partnership with the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division Public and Behavioral Health (DPBH) - Oral Health Program (OHP) launched the Medical Miles for Rural Smiles (MM4RS) pilot project to bring medical and dental services to rural counties in Nevada that have been identified as health professional shortage areas. Health professional shortage areas (HPSA) reflect the level of provider shortage for a service area. There are 441,382 Nevadans who live in dental HPSAs with an estimated 16.5% without access to care (Pew Charitable Trusts, 2011).

# **Next Steps**

More than 68% of adults surveyed rated the health of their teeth and gums as Fair/Poor.

More than 49% of adults reported not having insurance coverage to pay for some or all their routine dental care.

64% In addition, 64% of adults said there was said there was a time in the last 12 months when they needed dental care but could not get it at the time.

- Oral health is intimately related to the health of the rest of the body.
- · Changes in the mouth are often the first signs of problems elsewhere in the body such as infectious disease, nutritional deficiencies, cancers, and immune disorders.
- · Poor oral health and untreated oral disease also have a significant impact on a number of systemic diseases such as cardiovascular disease, bacterial pneumonia, diabetes, and low birth weight.

Continued funding for these programs is vital to ensure residents in these counties have access to early treatment and routine examinations to avoid emergency situations that can not only be costly to treat but life threatening when access to care is remote and burdensome to reach.
