Coalition Name: Future Smiles

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Successes

Brag about the success of a project, etc. Are there similar opportunities for success in other oral health coalitions?

In the 2017-2018 school year, Future Smiles has provided services at five EPODs, 50 mobile and community locations, and 10 schools in Northern Nevada. This includes approximately: 6,600 students screened, 6,400 fluoride varnish applications, oral health education and smile bags to 44,000 students, and 4,700 children protected with 21,000 sealants.

Recipient of the 2018 Nevada Women's Philanthropy (NWP) award. This funding will allow us to open the first school-based restorative dental center in the state. Building design and renovations for the NWP Dental Wellness Center is underway at the school-based health center on the Wynn Elementary School campus. Completion and opening date TBA.

Barriers

What coalition role(s) (i.e., community outreach, leadership development, oral health education, fundraising, membership engagement, sustainability, etc.) are you most concerned about?

Sustainability continues to be an element of concern. Currently, NV Medicaid is exploring decreasing the reimbursement fee for fluoride varnish (approx. \$20 per application). Other reimbursement rates are under review that may discourage dentist from being a Medicaid provider.

Future Smiles' service population is a payer-mix of 44% Medicaid and 56% uninsured. As the safety-net provider for Nevada's low-income school age youth, our effectiveness is linked to Medicaid rates, enrollment, client utilization and dentist partnership – referral base to a dental home.

Future Smiles would like to see more open dialogue with Nevada Medicaid and dental professionals who are engaged in serving the most vulnerable citizens in our state.

<u>Impactful Strategi</u>es Include:

- 1) Nevada Medicaid Advisory Committee A mix of all provers types, insurance representatives, community coalitions, Oral Health Program, and NV policy experts from throughout the state
- 2) Increase at-risk population's enrollment into the Medicaid system
- 3) Minimum prevention care (screenings, exam, sealants and fluoride varnish) for <u>ALL of Nevada's children</u>

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- 4) Increase in the rates for critical Medicaid dental services provided by dentist(s) to include: dental exams, extractions, restorative services and temporary restorative treatments SDF and IRT
- 5) Incentivize dentist to enroll in Medicaid
- 6) Monitor Medicaid enrollee utilization
