The demonstration award is not a fixed dollar amount. It is like an 1115 waiver which allows states to innovate and add other services. The demonstration award is a funding enhancement. It permits states to claim expenditures related to payments made for CCBHC services at an enhanced Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) rate for two years. FMAPs are used in determining the amount of Federal matching funds for State expenditures for assistance payments for certain social services, and State medical and medical insurance expenditures. b. We are evaluating other funding options. The budget is being developed for presentation to the legislature. c. Yes, all 4 prospective CCBHCs have been selected to be part of the demonstration program. CCBHC certification will be a 2-step process beginning with provisional certification.
