Other duties include Assisting on EMS calls, management of Fire, HAZMAT, and Rescue calls. With all fire truck maintenance being completed at the ANG fire station, I was dual trained as a Firefighter/Emergency Medical Technician. I transferred to the 911th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron (Air Force Reserve) in Pittsburg, PA as a C-130 Aeromedical Evacuation Technician. Upon my assignment to the 911th, I attended the Medical Service Apprentice course where I earned the Honor Graduate award. I then attended the Aeromedical Evacuation Technician course where I earned the Distinguished Graduate award. During my service as an Aeromedical Evacuation Technician, I flew many missions at home and abroad. I joined the 152^d Medical Group, Nevada Air National Guard in 1999. Since that time, I held numerous positions of increasing responsibility to include Immunizations NCOIC, Treatment Room NCOIC, Physical Exams NCOIC, Aerospace Medicine NCOIC, First Sergeant and my most recent assignments were as the Nursing Services Superintendent and Superintendant of CERFP. Additionally, while serving with the NVANG, I was a consistent volunteer for deployment and have deployed as a key senior leader to New Orleans, Louisiana to support Hurricane Katrina medical operations, Landstuhl Regional Medical Center in Germany to provide medical support to injured troops, and Bolivia to provide medical care to impoverished villages. Formerly I provided supervision to fifty medical technicians and fifty ancillary within the 152nd Medical Group, and assisted in training, certification and development of sustained skill levels in all medical personnel. I provided oversight in the Chemical, Biological, Nuclear, Explosive-
