- 5. <u>Informational Only:</u> Discussion and update of possible State of Nevada EMS-C programs and items-Dr. Sandra Horning, Chair
 - a. Handtevy training funding and implementation

Nicole Brown introduced herself and explained that the committee is moving forward with handtevy, they are looking at defining the scope, looking at numbers and are hoping to have implementation by the end of the year.

Michael Bologlu explained that with the new fiscal year, the EMSC grant has allocated \$34,000 towards handtevy implementation. The EMS Office is looking into different sources like universities who have previously helped greatly.

Sandra Horning explained what handtevy is in case anyone was unaware. She explained that it is a system for EMS Personnel to better take care of critically ill children. It helps calculate dosing, and other things needed to make helping these children as swift as possible.

Nicole Brown added that, it is also moving to an adult system as well, and not just for pediatrics.

b. Pediatric Disaster Preparedness

Irene Navis introduced herself and explained to the committee that she is the Nevada coordinator for called RAPM Western Region lined for pediatric Emergency Management. She said she is also in a program called pediatric pandemic network, within this she is affiliated with UCSF in San Fransisco under contract to represent a domain for CBRN, chemical, biological, etc.

She explains that in these two different arenas she is working on different projects, such as, a workshop that will be put online for a chemical response plan update. Irene says, the website has recently been updated with new resources related to all different types of pediatric disaster preparedness.

With both programs, the hope is to gain Nevada hospitals as part of the UPN network, as the program grows.

c. ED Pediatric Readiness Recognition Program

Sandra Horning explained that ED Pediatric Readiness Recognition Program has been put out nationally to give pediatric emergency departments a higher level of awareness when it comes to pediatrics.

Sandra expresses her desire to get the committee more involved with improving the care and giving recognition for excellent pediatric care.

Some ideas that Sandra has thought of for giving recognition, it would be good to go in and see the level of pediatric care and give suggestions on how they can improve, and see if there are any resources, we

can provide them with. Sandra suggested creating a sub- committee to slowly implement this and volunteered to be the first member.

d. Informational EMS-C Newsletter and Education

Sandra Horning and Douglas Oxborrow have received several articles for this but need more individuals to help with it.

e. Pediatric pre- hospital education resources to include development of a Pediatric Resource Panel

Sandra explains that it would be smart to create a list of resources and express to people the different individuals they can reach out to regarding their expertise.

Bobbie Sullivan explained that the EMS Office is working on an FAQ page for the website, and if the committee would like, that could go on the website as well.

Michael Bologlu brought up the idea of adding an EMSC committee page on the EMS Office website so everything the EMSC committee is doing can be known across the state.

f. Pediatric Urgent Care education resources

Sandra Horning decided to remove this from the agenda and add it to the next meeting agenda.

g. EMS supraglottic airways in children (I- Gels)

Dr. David Slattery apologized that he did not finish the project he was working on with this but ensured it would be done soon and sent it over to Douglas Oxborrow.

Douglas Oxborrow explained that the EMS Office received the second shipment of pediatric restraints, and it was just enough for REMSA. The third shipment is in the works.
