Health Care Survey data*

Immediate Jeopardy (IJ) – A facility is cited with immediate jeopardy if it receives any deficiency at scope and severity level J, K or L (actual harm that possess immediate jeopardy to resident health or safety). Consequences include the immediate imposition of remedies as opposed to a grace period for correcting deficiencies.

Certification and Survey Provider Enhanced Reporting (CASPER) formerly known as Online Survey, Certification and Reporting System (OSCAR) – A database maintained by Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) which contains the survey, certification, complaint and enforcement activity on healthcare providers contracting with the government to provide Medicare and Medicaid services to beneficiaries. The CASPER database for standard surveys contains four records per provider entity. These records include the most recent inspection (current survey) and three previous inspections (prior, second prior, and third prior surveys).

Standard Health Survey – A standard health survey is the periodic inspection of the service provided by a facility to determine compliance with the requirements of Medicaid and Medicare participation. Standard health surveys are to be conducted at least once every 15 months at a facility.

Substandard Quality of Care (SQC) – Effective July 1, 1995, a provider entity is cited as providing substandard quality of care if it receives a deficiency in one or more of the following compliance categories: Quality of Care (F309 – F334), Quality of Life (F240 – F258) or resident Behavior and Facility Practices (F221 – F226) with a scope and severity level F, H, I, J, K, or L.

Substantial Compliance (SC) – A facility is designated as being in substantial compliance with all imposed regulations if the scope and severity of all cited deficiencies is recorded at A, B, or C or if the facility is found to be deficiency-free at the time of the survey.
