TO: Owners and Operators of Tattoo, Piercing, and Permanent Makeup Establishments (Invasive Body Decoration Establishments)

RE: Legislative Approval of amendments to NAC 444 "Sanitation"

Dear Owners and Operators,

The Nevada State Board of Health approved proposed regulation amendments to NAC 444, "Sanitation," on September 8, 2017. The goals of the proposed regulations changes were to:

- Adopt regulation amendments for Tattoos, piercings, and other forms of Invasive Body Decoration procedures that were currently unregulated state-wide in a manner that protects the health of the consumer in the State of Nevada.
- Allow for inspection oversight of invasive body decoration procedures, with the
 intent to reduce the risk of bloodborne disease and skin infection among patrons
 and operators by enforcing industry best practices in all establishments within the
 State.
- These regulation amendments would require all operators in the State to pay a permit fee (fee schedule listed at the end of this letter), and become subject to inspection by the Health Authority having jurisdiction.

The amendments to NAC 444 were subsequently approved on December 19, 2017 the State of Nevada's Legislative Counsel Bureau, and they have taken affect as of January 3, 2018. Sec. 115. 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the Division shall charge and collect fees for a permit to operate an invasive body decoration establishment in accordance with the following schedule:

Invasive body decoration establishment:

Annual Permit\$290

Mobile invasive body decoration establishment:

Per permit\$100

Temporary invasive body decoration establishment:

Per Permit.....\$125
