NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Intent to Adopt Regulations (LCB File No. R046-14)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Board of Health will hold a public hearing to consider adoption of regulations establishing requirements for the licensure of psychiatric residential treatment facilities, establishing grounds for the suspension and revocation of such a license, imposing certain fees for the issuance and renewal of such a license and providing other matters properly relating thereto. This public hearing is to be held in conjunction with the State Board of Health meeting on June 20, 2014. The proposed adoption of the regulations will be heard in the order placed on the State Board of Health agenda.

The State Board of Health will be conducted via videoconference beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, June 20, 2014 at the following locations:

The proposed adoption of regulations include the following:

- Establish the definition of a psychiatric residential treatment facility (PRTF) as: a facility, other than a hospital, that provides a range of psychiatric services to treat residents under the age of 21 years on an inpatient basis under the direction of a physician.
- Requires a license to operate or provide the services of a PRTF
- Requires a PRTF to meet the needs of and provide quality care to its residents
- Require the administrator of a PRTF to: (1) perform certain tasks relating to adequacy and competency of the staff and (2) ensure that the PRTF has an effective, comprehensive quality improvement program to evaluate the provision of care of its residents
- Establish requirements for the planning, preparation and provision of meals to residents of a PRTF
- Establish requirements concerning: (1) the administration of a medication or biological to a resident and (2) reporting of errors in the administration of drugs to residents and abuses and losses of controlled substances
- Prescribes fees for an applicant for a license to operate a PRTF or to renew such a license
- Authorizes the Division to suspend, revoke or cancel a license to operate as a PRTF under certain conditions

- 1. Anticipated effects on the businesses which these regulations will affect:
 - A. *Adverse effects*: There may be a negative economic impact on PRTFs, due to the licensure fees that have been established. However, these fees are necessary to offset the cost of inspections, complaint investigations and enforcement.
 - B. *Beneficial:* Anticipated benefits include: (1) a distinct licensure category and regulations different from psychiatric hospitals, (2) minimal regulations that should encourage development of PRTF facilities in Nevada and (3) once facilities are licensed, the ability to provide services in Nevada, rather than the current practice of placing persons in need of these services out-of-state.
 - C. *Immediate:* The stated adverse and beneficial effects would be immediate impacts as soon as the proposed regulations become effective.
 - D. *Long-term:* The long term impacts would be the same as the immediate impacts as it would not be expected that the impacts would go away.

2. Anticipated effects on the public:

- A. Adverse: None anticipated.
- B. *Beneficial:* When facilities are licensed in Nevada, the ability to locate persons in need of services in-state may better serve the families of those persons by providing services more proximal. These regulations are designed to establish minimal public health standards for the PRTF provider type.
- C. *Immediate*: The establishment of minimal public health standards would be the immediate impact, as soon as the proposed regulations become effective.
- D. *Long-term:* The long term beneficial impacts would be the location of persons in need of services in-state, once facilities have obtained licensure.
- 3. The estimated cost to the Division of Public and Behavioral Health for enforcement of the proposed regulations is estimated to be \$0. It is expected that the cost of implementing the provisions of these regulations would be offset by the licensure fees included within the regulations. The agency will utilize existing staff and incorporate this new facility type into current inspection and licensing processes, therefore no cost (\$0) to the agency is anticipated.

The proposed regulations do not overlap or duplicate any other Nevada regulations.

Members of the public may make oral comments at this meeting.
