## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Intent to Adopt Regulations (LCB File No. R104-13)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Board of Health will hold a public hearing to consider amendments to Chapter 652 of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC), Medical Laboratories. This public hearing is to be held in conjunction with the State Board of Health meeting on March 14, 2014. The NAC 652 regulation changes will be heard in the order placed on the State Board of Health agenda.

The State Board of Health will be conducted via videoconference beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, March 14, 2014 at the following locations:

The proposed changes to NAC 652 include the following:

- Amends the definition of an outpatient center of a laboratory
- Identifies the proof of identity of the laboratory director that must be included in a laboratory application. Proof of identity includes acceptance of electronic signatures which would facilitate moving forward with electronic submission of applications in the future.
- Requires a laboratory to adopt and implement nationally recognized infection control guidelines, follow manufacturer's recommendations and to ensure staff have received training and are evaluated on the infection control guidelines.
- Changes the requirement for the laboratory director to be on the premises of the laboratory from 10 or 30 consecutive days to once every month.
- Clarifies the procedures which can be performed by a laboratory assistant.
- Specifies that individuals convicted of felonies listed in NRS 449.174 may have their certificate denied, suspended or revoked.
- Specifies the requirements to qualify for certification as a laboratory assistant.
- Outlines monetary penalties and criteria for determining the amount of the penalty.
- 1. Anticipated effects on the business which NAC 652 regulates:

- A. *Adverse effects*: May have a negative economic impact on laboratories that have deficient practices that lead to an administrative sanction.
- B. *Beneficial:* Anticipated benefits to laboratory personnel and medical laboratories include the ability to move forward with electronic applications/renewals which should make it more efficient for applicants and should result in faster turnaround times, increasing the flexibility in criteria to become a laboratory assistant will ensure qualified individuals can become certified and reducing the on-site requirement that a laboratory director be on the premises from 10 or 30 consecutive days to monthly will provided more flexibility for laboratory director's while ensuring patient safety.
- C. *Immediate:* The stated adverse and beneficial effects would be immediate impacts as soon as the proposed regulations become effective.
- D. *Long-term:* The long term impacts would be the same as the immediate impacts as it would not be expected that the impacts would go away.
- 2. Anticipated effects on the public:
  - A. Adverse: None anticipated.
  - B. *Beneficial:* Increased patient safety. Monetary penalties would be used to improve quality in laboratories by allowing laboratories to use the monies to help prevent future violations and monetary penalties would serve to help promote compliance with statutes and regulations to help ensure public safety. In addition, utilizing nationally recognized infection control standards will help protect patients.
  - C. Immediate: Increased patient safety.
  - D. Long-term: Increased patient safety.
- 3. The estimated cost to the Division of Public and Behavioral Health for enforcement of the proposed regulations is estimated to be \$0. Currently it is expected that the provisions of these regulations would be incorporated into current inspection and licensing processes utilizing existing staff therefore no cost (\$0) to the agency for enforcement is anticipated.

The proposed regulations do not overlap or duplicate any other Nevada state regulations.

Members of the public may make oral comments at this meeting.
