

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Intent to Adopt Regulations
(LCB File No. R144-13RP4)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Board of Health will hold a public hearing to consider amendments to Chapter 457 & 459 of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC), Cancer and Hazardous Materials. This public hearing is to be held in conjunction with the State Board of Health meeting on March 11, 2016. The NAC 457 & 459 regulation changes will be heard in the order placed on the State Board of Health agenda.

The State Board of Health will be conducted via videoconference beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, March 11, 2016 at the following locations:

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The proposed regulations to NAC 457 & 459 include the following: The proposed addition/change of regulations in LCB File No. R144-13RP4 include provisions for:

- Fees for duplicate mammography technologists’ certificates.
- Amends and modifies existing language to make regulations more clear, current and compatible with the intent and scope of the Program.
- Adoption by reference of certain NRC Regulations Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations.
- Regulation authorizing the Division to impose enforcement actions.
- Clarification of Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) requirements.
- Broaden regulation fee structure for certain specific licenses to provide for a reduction in fees.

1. Anticipated effects on the business which NAC 457 & 459 regulates:

- A. *Adverse effects:* May have a negative economic impact on Licensees, registrants and stakeholders which have deficient practices that lead to an administrative sanction.
- B. *Beneficial:* Clearly defines what is expected of the regulated community. Protects the public from unnecessary exposure to harmful ionizing radiation. Involves no new cost or fee. Amend and modify existing language to make regulations more clear, current and compatible with the intent and scope of the Radiation Control Program.
- C. *Immediate:* The stated adverse and beneficial effects would be immediate impacts as soon as the proposed regulations become effective.

- D. *Long-term*: The long term impacts would be the same as the immediate impacts as it would not be expected that the impacts would go away.
2. Anticipated effects on the public:
- A. *Adverse*: None anticipated.
 - B. *Beneficial*: Increased public health and safety.
 - C. *Immediate*: Increased public health and safety.
 - D. *Long-term*: Increased public health and safety.
3. At this time, there is no estimated cost to the Division of Public and Behavioral Health for enforcement of the proposed regulations. Enforcement of the proposed regulations will be incorporated into current administrative, registration, licensing and inspection processes.
4. The amendments do not increase any existing fees. The amendments do expand the radioactive material license fee structure for certain specific licenses (Veterinary) to provide for a reduction in fees.
5. The proposed regulations do not overlap or duplicate any other Nevada state regulations. Proposed regulations. Title 10, Code of Federal Regulation, Part 37 is proposed to be adopted by reference, for regulations to stay compatible with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.
6. Per NRS 233B.0608(3), A Small Business Impact Questionnaire was mailed to all Radiation Control Program licensees and registrants in October, 2015. Negative comments revealed there was a perceived increase in Radiation Producing Machine (RPM) registration fees. The proposed regulations do not increase RPM registration fees, as it was determined from analysis of the comments that respondents miss-read proposed regulations. Respondents were contacted to correct the perceived impact. Negative comments also revealed a perception of new regulation requiring a Radiation Safety Officer for RPM registrants. Comments revealed respondents miss-read proposed regulation which clarifies training and education of Radiation Safety Officers for specific licenses not RPM registrants. Respondents were contacted to correct the perceived impact.
7. Per NRS 233B.064(2), upon adoption of any regulation, the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person, either prior to adoption or within 30 days thereafter, shall issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption, and incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.
8. Members of the public may make oral comments at this meeting. Persons wishing to submit written testimony or documentary evidence in excess of two typed, 8-1/2" x 11" pages must submit the material to the Board's Secretary, Cody Phinney, to be received no later than March 1, 2016 at the following address:
