Purpose

The primary purpose of this report is to provide the most current and accurate mortality data for local health authority, researchers and other members of general public.

This report includes information about mortality and its causes both demographically and geographically.

The Nevada Registration System

The Bureau of Health Statistics, Planning, and Emergency Response is the official government entity that collects, processes, and maintains the State of Nevada's vital records. These responsibilities are delegated to the Office of Vital Records (OVS) and the Office of Public Health Informatics and Epidemiology (OPHIE) within Division of Public and Behavioral Health, of which each section's primary responsibilities, as related to the state's vital records, are as follows:

OVS has two distinct components:

The Vital Records Section where records from local entities are filed and public requests for certified copies and amendments of said copies are processed.

The Quality Control/Data Entry Section where the records are checked for completeness and accuracy and then entered into databases on the State mainframe computer system.

OPHIE analyzes, prepares, and publishes reports based on statistics from the vital statistics databases and also provided technical assistance to users for these data.

Births in all counties are recorded electronically, directly with the State Registrar; except in Clark and Washoe Counties, where they are initially processed and then transmitted to the State Registrar. Responsibility for the filing of the birth certificate lies with the hospital medical records, nursing personnel, the physician, midwife or other attendant.

All records are checked for completeness and accuracy, and then given a state file number before they are encoded and entered into the state's database. Birth records are kept on permanent file for certification use and amendment when necessary by the public and various government agencies.

When a certificate is found to be inaccurate or incomplete, personnel follow up with the providing entity in accordance with NRS 440.150 to make the necessary corrections and/or improvements to make the record complete and satisfactory. It should be noted that the quality of data presented in this report is directly related to the completeness and accuracy of the information contained on the certificate.

This report summarizes data compiled from original birth records filed with OVS as discussed in NRS 440. Standard forms recommended by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) are used for all birth records.

Users of this publication are welcome to offer their comments and/or suggestions concerning format, content, technical aspects of the publication, or requests for additional data.

Definitions

- Residence Data :** The usual residence of the individual. For death, this is define as the usual residence of decedent as indicated on the certificate. Fro fetal death, the residence is define as the usual place of residence of the mother .
- Occurrence Data:** Data allocated by place where the event occurred, regardless of the person's place of residence.
- Death:** A Person who has sustained irreversible cessation of all functioning of the brain, including the brain stem, is considered dead.
- Underlying Cause of Death:** The Disease or condition which gave rise to the chain of morbid events leading to death, including the circumstances of an accident or violent event that produced a fatal injury.
- Population Data:** The Nevada populatin data used in this report are based on the database established by the Nevada state Demographer's Office as part of the NV Small Business Development Center and funded by the NV Department of Taxation. We use 2011 estimates for this publication. Due to these changes in methodology, rates for subgroups published inthis report may not match or be directly cmparable to past years, and should be used with caution when compared to other published rates.
- Data Sources:** The information provided in this report is based on data from Web-Enabled Vital Records Registry System (WEVRRS) and Electronic Death Registry System (EDRS).
