Governor Signs Senate Bill 419 into Law, Marking the State's Continued Commitment to Improving Patient Safety

Carson City – Yesterday, Nevada Governor, Brian Sandoval, signed Senate Bill 419 (SB419) into law. Senate Bill 419 requires certain healthcare professionals, as a condition for issuance or renewal of a license, registration or certificate to attest to knowledge of and compliance with the guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention concerning the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices. In addition, a physician shall attest that any person, who is under the control and supervision of the physician; who is not licensed pursuant to the applicable Nevada Revised Statutes; and whose duties involve injection practices, has knowledge of and is in compliance with the same guidelines. The new law takes effect on October 1, 2011.

State Health Officer, Dr. Tracey D. Green said, "What is really great is that materials have already been developed and are available now to assist Nevada's healthcare professionals to comply with the provisions of the new law."
