Kristy Zigenis with our Immunization program is here to give us some information for programs interested in stocking and administering the COVID vaccination. If you are interested, please email DPBH-AVARS@health.nv.gov to express interest in enrolling to store and administer COVID vaccines. We have Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson. There are a few enrollment steps that will need to be completed before you can begin the process of ordering and administering. Ms. Adie: The 1115 Demonstration Waiver public hearing will be held on October 26th, this is when the IMD waiver application will be read, and feedback will be heard.

Discussions went back and forth on pros and cons of the waiver and how it has affected California.

Ms. Adie: Read the overview of The Support Act and mentioned that publication may be ready in October, if not sooner.

Ms. Adie showed the newly launched provider tools that can be found on our website https://dpbh.nv.gov/Programs/ClinicalSAPTA/dta/Partners/ToolsforProviders/

Discussion on using website to maintain detox compliance, certifications are months behind, but DHHS is working on resolutions and confirmed that if applications are submitted but certifications are not received on provider end, provider not out of compliance.

Ms. Ross brought up struggles with CASAT recertifications asking for a unique identifier numbers or online log in information that is not located on any documentation.



Ms. Adie spoke about a Health Disparity grant that was awarded to the State of Nevada by the CDC. Division of Public and Behavioral Health will be working with the Office of Minority Health and Equity to expand data collection and improve health equity and services.

Ms. Quillici asked who writes these and who sees the need, etcetera

Ms. Adie states that the data was collected through town halls, collecting data through surveys and the office of minority health and equity coalitions, there was a minority health report done in February 2021.

Ms. Adie reviewed the subgrants that were already finished and block grant funding that is in the works now. We are working on getting a contract with Qualtrics to start doing our web-based surveys, there is no timeline yet.

 SOR 2, year 2 funding approved, we are looking at recovery housing services.
 GIPRA rates increased from 87% to 92%.
 Naloxone kits distributed in June was 693, from October to date was 5743.
 CASAT training has changed training platforms, the name is CASAT learning.
 We are working on acquiring Fentanyl test strips for distribution.
