Inaudible from Addiction Medicine Fellowship asked if there are budget numbers that are listed there, what is available through this entire block grant, or specific to what is available for Nevada.

Tracy Palmer stated the numbers that we are reflecting on page 3 for the federal fiscal year 20 through 23 Substance Abuse Block Grant, prevention and treatment block grant for the State of Nevada.

David Robeck from Bridge asked if this was posted on SAPTA website?

Tracy Palmer answered it is posted on the SAPTA website and Listserv

Marianne McKown from Vitality Unlimited stated they have been approached by their Sheriff's Office to provide substance abuse treatment groups in Elko County Jail, is there money from this grant that we can use for a new service like that?

Tracy Palmer answered grant funds are not allocated for jail services.

Marianne McKown stated they have a new women's house for substance abuse treatment, we are looking for funds to furnish the new facility, can we use or would block grant monies be available for something like that? It is a treatment facility for substance abuse.

Tracy Palmer stated that this is not a question that can be addressed in a public meeting. You would need to ask your program officer.
