If It Sounds Like A Duck Improving What We Do & How We Do It As Instructors

Is a picture worth a thousand words? Absolutely! Your student's mental record of experiences begins in your classroom. Incidents present CUES that when recognized by your students will elicit a response that has been captured or played out in their training experiences. Key to this process is the ability to recognize a situation and its CUES. This type of decision-making is called Recognition Primed Decision Making or RPDM. RPMD has serves us well....IF IT Sounds Like a Duck, it is most likely a duck! Training, ride-alongs, hospital time, and hands-on help to imprint mental experiences in your students of EMS.
