This email is for public comment regarding the Friday (8/20) 9am meeting to discuss emergency regulations for NSHE students and COVID-19 vaccine.

Requiring vaccinations for the health and safety of students, faculty, and staff of educational institutions is nothing new. To attend NSHE schools, students must be up to date with MMR, TD, and meningococcal vaccines, all of which are deadly. To protect NSHE campuses, requiring COVID-19 vaccinations of students who intend to learn in person is necessary. As a graduate student and faculty member at UNLV, as well as an in-person adjunct instructor at CSN, the idea that students can return to on-campus instruction without vaccination is scary.
