I am reaching out regarding NSHE potentially mandating COVID 19 vaccines for college students and staff. Mandating these vaccines violates a person's bodily autonomy and strips a person of many basic human rights. How is it that one person has the right to require another person to inject something into their body that they either find to be harmful or in violation of their religious beliefs?
