Good Morning,

My name is Anthony Anguille-Valles, and I am an Osteopathic Physician and concerned student attending UNLV's William S. Boyd School of Law. I'm writing to express my strong support for the proposed amendment to NAC 441A.755 implementing a COVID-19 vaccine requirement for students enrolling in classes at NSHE institutions.

The argument that mandated vaccination for in-person attendance at state universities raises constitutional claims or violates individual constitutional rights is utterly false. The Seventh Circuit affirmed Indiana University's recent implementation of a COVID-19 vaccination policy earlier this month. As stated by the Court, under Jacobson v. Massachusetts (1905), "there can't be a constitutional problem with vaccination against SARS-CoV-2," because there is no fundamental right to refuse necessary public health measures such as vaccines.

Additionally, claims of religious and/or medical exemptions are baseless and derived in pretext. There are no organized religions that are historically anti-vaccination. The CDC has not recognized any absolute medical contraindications to the COVID-19 vaccine other than known anaphylactic allergy to a component contained in any given vaccine. Those who are immunocompromised are advised to not only obtain the vaccine but to obtain a booster sooner than those of "normal" health to bolster their immunity. Accordingly, it behooves the State Board of Health to strongly scrutinize such arguments knowing that they are

largely a cloak behind which the politically motivated can conveniently hide.

The COVID-19 pandemic is a public health emergency that requires proactive measures to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 on NSHE campuses. The safety and wellbeing of thousands of Nevadans is in your hands, and I encourage you to make the correct decision for all of us devoid of partisanship.
