Our kids are dealing with enough pressure as it is without having to worry about choosing between an education and medical tyranny.

Thirdly, the Covid-19 vaccine continues to be a trial/experimental vaccine, which is not expected to be FDA approved until 2023. Therefore, a mandate of this vaccine is in violation of the Nuremburg Code, as stated here: The Nuremberg Code (cirp.org)

The voluntary consent of the human subject is absolutely essential. This means that the person involved should have legal capacity to give consent; should be so situated as to be able to exercise free power of choice, without the intervention of any element of force, fraud, deceit, duress, overreaching, or other ulterior form of constraint or coercion; and should have sufficient knowledge and comprehension of the elements of the subject matter involved as to enable him to make an

understanding and enlightened decision. This latter element requires that before the acceptance of an affirmative decision by the experimental subject there should be made known to him the nature, duration, and purpose of the experiment; the method and means by which it is to be conducted; all inconveniences and hazards reasonably to be expected; and the effects upon his health or person which may possibly come from his participation in the experiment.

This should be more than enough reason to absolutely avoid the decision to mandate any vaccines at any university in this country. Due to limited space I will close with the following quote from Thomas Jefferson; "If people let government decide which foods they eat and medicines they take, their bodies will soon be in as sorry a state as are the souls of those who live under tyranny."
