JOHN CARLSON FOR THE CARSON CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT is requesting a variance from NAC 450B.720 which states:

### NAC 450B.720 Programs of training: Application for approval; retention of documentation by provider; certification prerequisites to receive certain training.

(NRS 450B.120, 450B.155, 450B.160, 450B.1905, 450B.191, 450B.195)

- 1. The Division shall, within the limits of its appropriated money, conduct or contract with other persons to conduct the programs of training necessary to bring each service, including a volunteer service, and each attendant into compliance with the requirements of this chapter for training.
- 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5, a person proposing to conduct a program within this state for training for certification issued under this chapter must apply to the Division for approval at least 20 working days before the program is to begin. The Division shall not issue a certificate of completion of the program to any trainee unless the Division has approved the program. The person conducting the program shall not start the program until approval by the Division has been granted.
- 3. The Division shall not issue retroactive approval for a program which has been conducted without its approval.
- 4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5, curriculum and procedures for testing submitted as part of a request for approval of a program must not be changed after approval has been granted for the program except upon prior written approval from the Division. The proposed change or modification, with an alternative acceptable to the Division, must be submitted in writing to the Division not less than 15 working days before the effective date of the use of the changed or modified curriculum or test.
- 5. The provisions of subsections 2 and 4 do not apply to a program of continuing education offered by a training center.
- 6. Conferences, online courses and continuing education that are approved by the Commission on Accreditation for Pre-Hospital Continuing Education or the Division are deemed to qualify for use to satisfy the requirements of this chapter relating to training for the renewal of a license or certificate if the conference, online course or continuing education is appropriate to the license or certificate.
- 7. A person who conducts a program of training shall retain documentation of courses completed by students for at least 5 years after the date on which the course was completed.
  - 8. A person must:
- (a) Be certified as an emergency medical technician before receiving training for certification as an advanced emergency medical technician.
- (b) Be certified as an advanced emergency medical technician before receiving training for certification as a paramedic.
- (c) Maintain the certification described in paragraph (a) or (b), as applicable, until the completion of training for certification as an advanced emergency medical technician or paramedic, as applicable.

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ATTENTION: Please read this section closely. Your request for variance will be examined against these criteria:

Any person who, because of unique circumstances, is unduly burdened by a regulation of the State Board of Health and thereby suffers a hardship and the abridgement of a substantial property right may apply for a variance from a regulation. (NAC 439.200(1))

- 1. The State Board of Health will grant a variance from a regulation only if it finds from the evidence presented at the hearing that:
  - (a) There are circumstances or conditions which:
    - (1) Are unique to the applicant;
    - (2) Do not generally affect other persons subject to the regulation;
    - (3) Make compliance with the regulation unduly burdensome; and
    - (4) Cause a hardship to and abridge a substantial property right of the applicant; and
  - (b) Granting the variance:
    - (1) Is necessary to render substantial justice to the applicant and enable him to preserve and enjoy his property; and
    - (2) Will not be detrimental or pose a danger to public health and safety.
- 2. Whenever an applicant for a variance alleges that he suffers or will suffer economic hardship by complying with the regulation, he must submit evidence demonstrating the costs of his compliance with the regulation. The Board will consider the evidence and determine whether those costs are unreasonable. (NAC 439.240)

**RE:** Case # 737, Mr. John Carlson, Carson City Fire Department

Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 450B.720 (8) states:

8. A person must: (a) Be certified as an emergency medical technician before receiving training for certification as an advanced emergency medical technician. (b) Be certified as an advanced emergency medical technician before receiving training for certification as a paramedic. (c) Maintain the certification described in paragraph (a) or (b), as applicable, until the completion of training for certification as an advanced emergency medical technician or paramedic, as applicable.

#### **STAFF REVIEW**

John Carlson with Carson City Fire Department ("Applicant") has submitted a request for variance from the requirements of NAC 450B.720(8)(b). Applicant is requesting approval to allow him as a certified Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) to enter into a paramedic program of training without first having to be certified as an Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT).

#### **DEGREE OF RISK TO PUBLIC**

There is little to no risk to the public health in allowing the Applicant to train as a Paramedic without first having to be certified as an AEMT. Current industry standard allows for EMTs to receive training as a Paramedic.

#### **EXCEPTIONAL AND UNDUE HARDSHIP**

In approximately 2015/2016, based on recommendation of the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Committee, the regulation was changed to require certification as an AEMT, a prerequisite to enter a paramedic course to allow the opportunity for the candidate to gain experience as an AEMT, before entering the paramedic training program.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT RECEIVED**

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

Division of Public and Behavioral Health (DPBH) staff recommend the State Board of Health approve Case # 737, John Carlson, from Carson City Fire Department variance to NAC 450B.720(8)(b). Approving this request will align with the current proposal being done by the Emergency Medical Services office, through a regulatory change to remove the requirement from regulation, opening the opportunity for emergency medical services providers to enter the paramedic training without first having to apply for a variance to this regulation.
