This presentation aims to demonstrate the numbers reported on referrals, caseload, waitlist, and program type by the Autism Treatment and Assistance Program (ATAP) which are current through February 28, 2021.

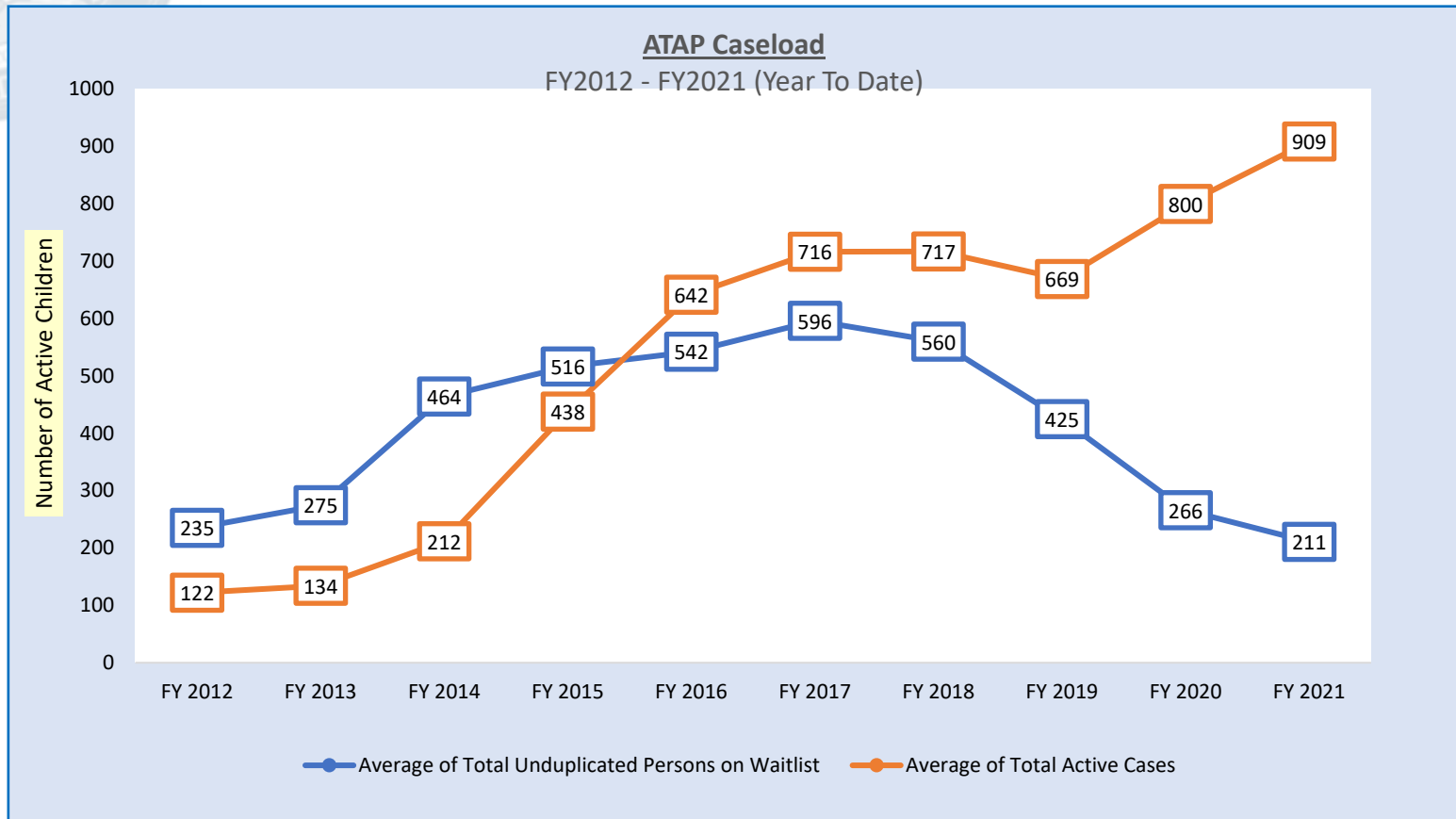
ATAP Caseload

Monthly caseload for February 2021

- 46 new applications
- 896 active children, average age: 9 years old
- 84 total inactive children:
 - 47 Straight ATAP – Average age of 6 years old
 - 37 Service Coordination – Average age of 9 years old
- Average wait time for all ATAP children (*days from application start date to the date the child drops or becomes active*):
 - 161 Days



ATAP Caseload Growth

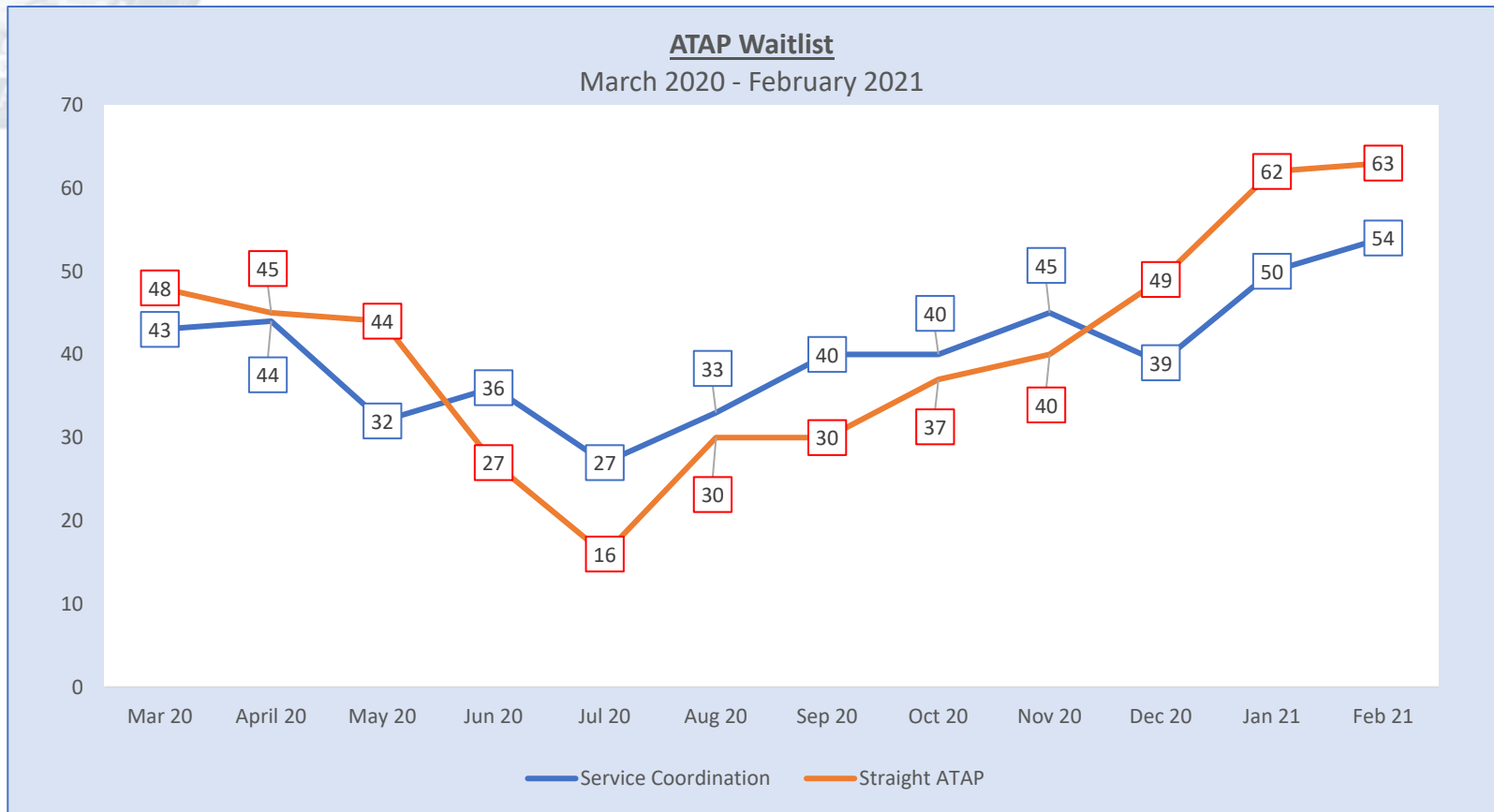


The chart above demonstrates the active caseload and waitlist averages over time. These numbers are derived from the CLEO report.

This data includes children in referral status.



Waitlist Elimination Progress

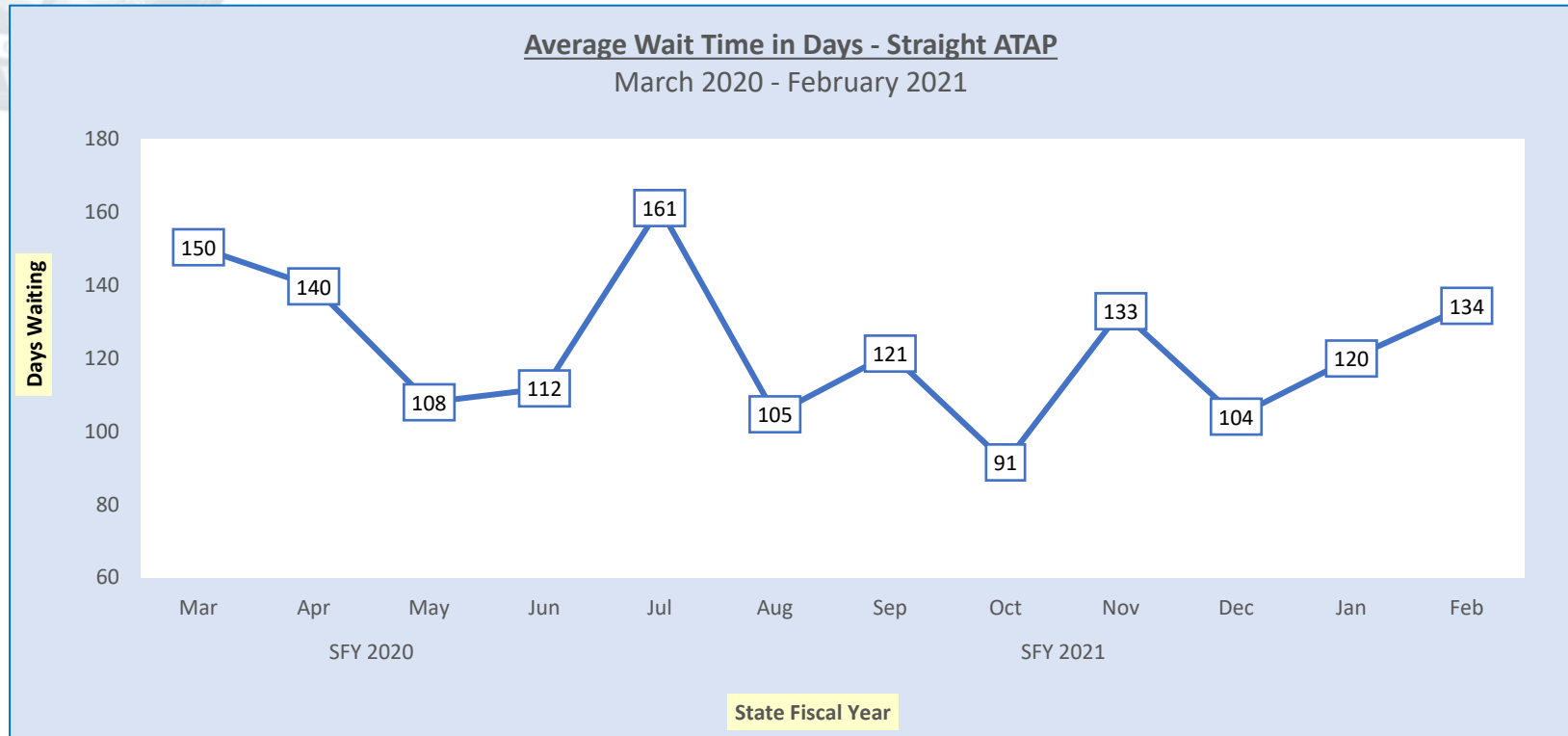


The graph above shows the monthly waitlist as occurred from March 2020 through February 2021.

Trend in Wait Time



The graph above demonstrates the average number of days waiting for children who are “Pending” or “In Process” to become either “Active” or “Dropped” in the program.

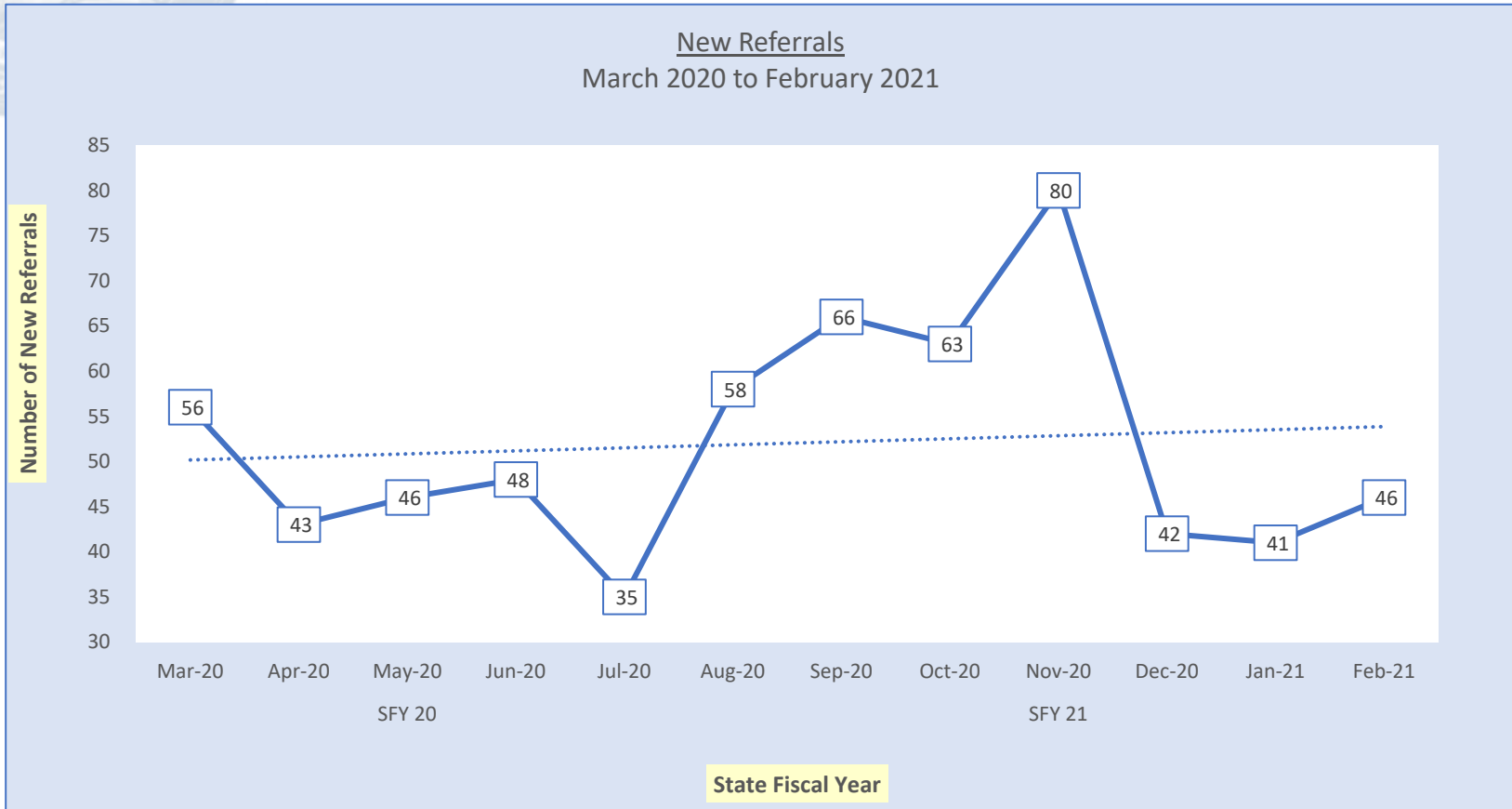
**Wait time average includes all time child spent from application start date until they were either Dropped or went Active.*

New Referrals

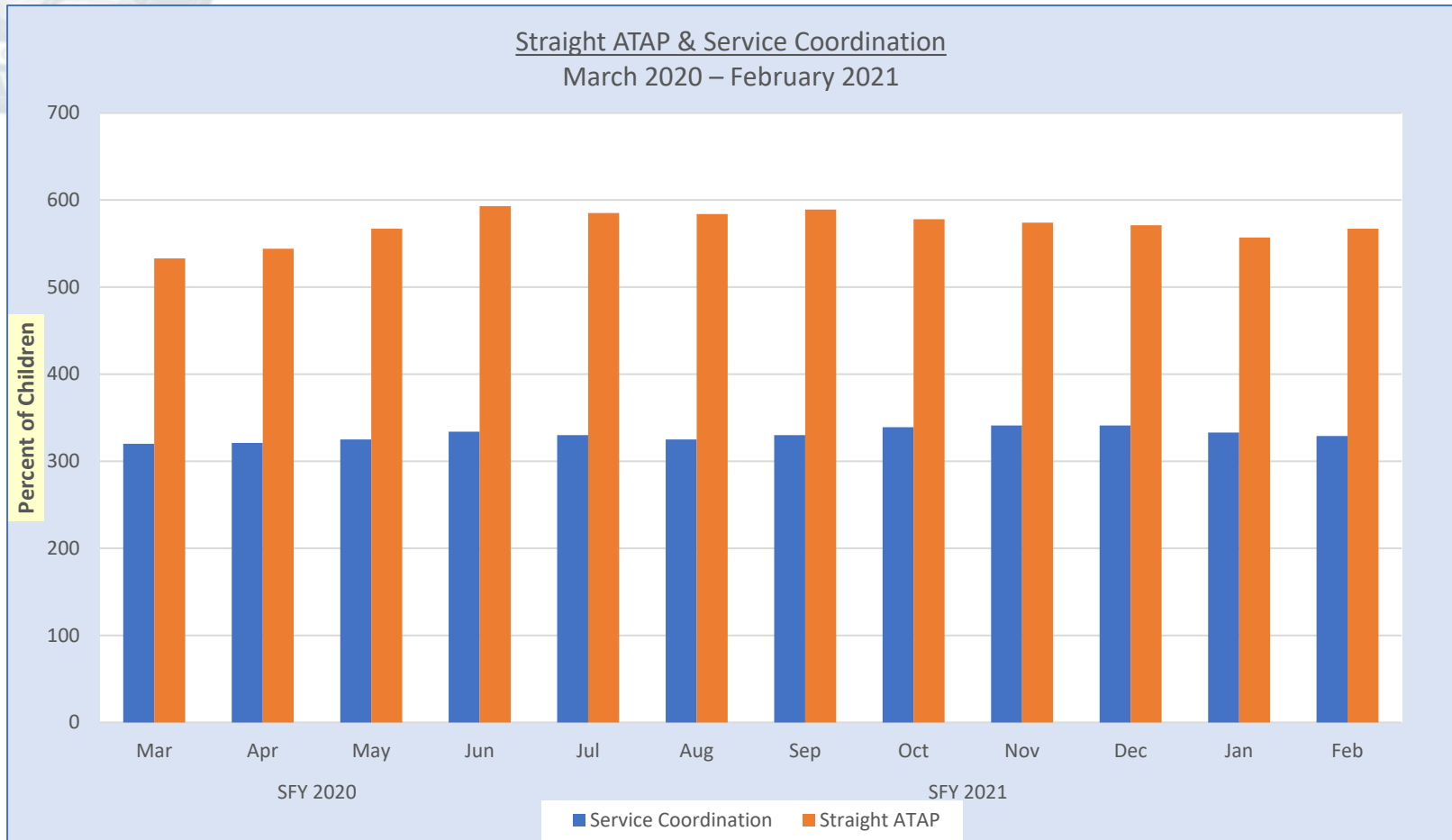


The chart above demonstrates the number of new referrals entering the ATAP system. The impact of the moratorium is apparent especially during the months of March through August 2020.

Straight ATAP & Service Coordination

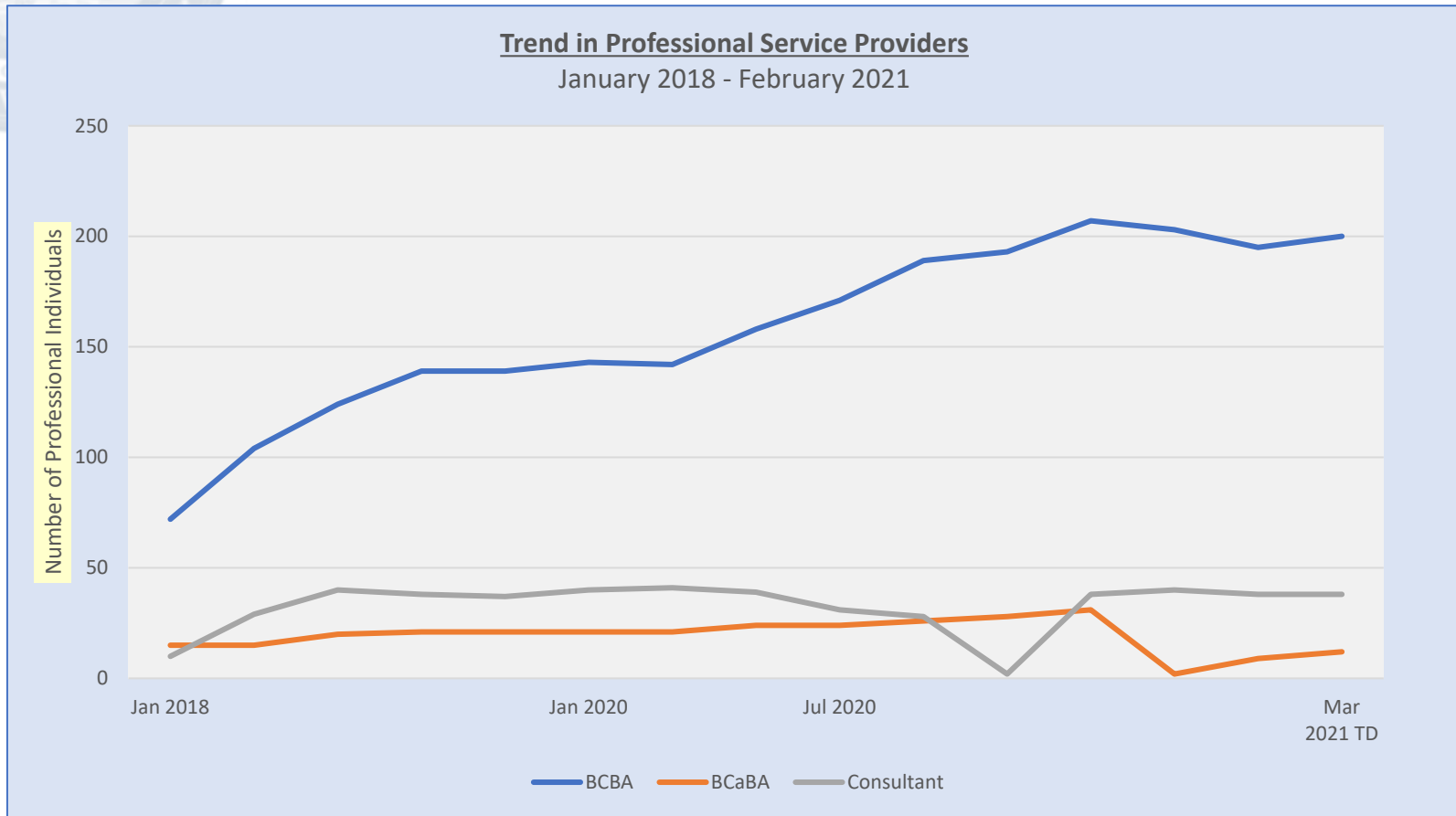


This chart shows the comparison between Straight ATAP and Medicaid Caseload (Service Coordination).

Professional Growth – BCBA Level

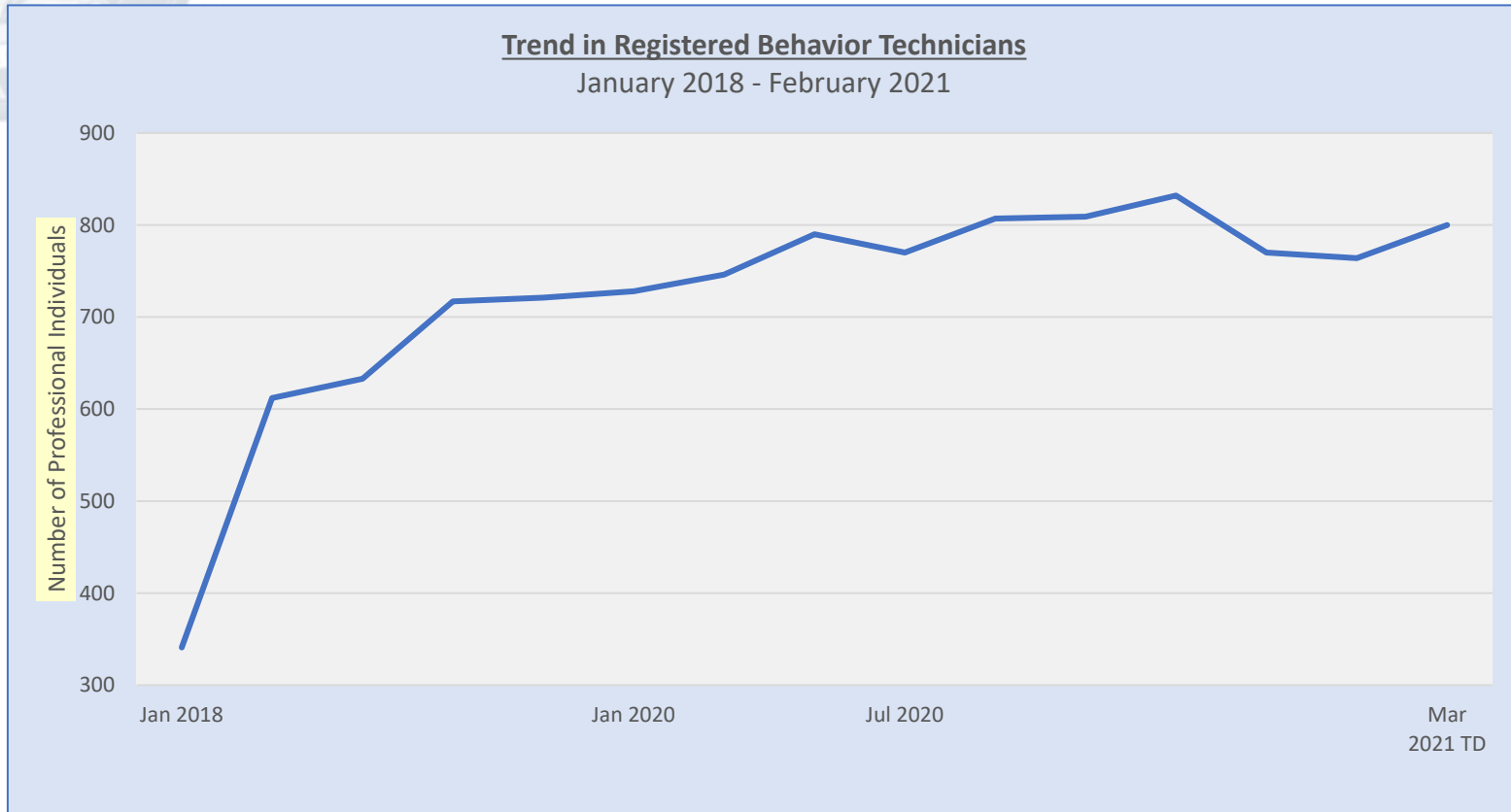


The chart above shows the trend in growth of professional service providers.
