Digest Existing law requires the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and

Human Services to perform certain duties relating to the provision of mental health services in this State. (NRS 433.331-433.374) Section 5 of this bill requires the Division to establish a pilot program to respond to persons suffering from mental health crises in certain sparsely populated counties. Specifically, the pilot program provides for the transportation of a person with mental illness who is detained on an emergency basis to a mental health facility: (1) by someone other than a law enforcement officer; (2) within a reasonable time; and (3) in a manner that is safe and dignified. Additionally, the pilot program provides for an initial in-person response to a mental health crisis by trained emergency medical personnel or law enforcement officers working in collaboration with a mental health professional, either in person or through telehealth. The pilot program also provides for a follow-up response by a case manager that is designed to address the ongoing needs of the person who experienced the mental health crisis. Section 6 of this bill makes an appropriation to the Division to pay certain costs of the pilot

program.
