# Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS)

 Annual survey that collects information on health risk behaviors, preventative health practices, chronic health conditions, and use of preventive services

## • Indicators:

 Physical and mental health, suicide ideation and attempts, substance use, tobacco use, adverse childhood experiences, sexual orientation, gender identity

- Data only reflect information respondents are willing to provide.
- Sample size is usually small and may not be representative of the population.
- State specific questions are not comparable nationally.
- Not every question is asked every year.

# Electronic Birth/Death Registry System (EBRS/EDRS)

- Statewide births and deaths are collected by the Office of Vital Records
- Indicators:
  - Deaths
    - Suicide, cause of death, place of death
  - Births
    - Prenatal substance use
- Limitations:
  - Delay in reporting due to autopsy/toxicology
  - Personal information is reported by next of kin



# Center for Health Information Analysis (CHIA)

 Hospital billing data for emergency department encounters and inpatient admissions for Nevada's non-federal hospitals

### Indicators:

 Data are based off diagnosis and include hospital visits for any reason

- Hospital billing data are reported to the University of Nevada, Las Vegas
- Based on what the hospitals billed
- Does not include literals for chief complaint or diagnosis

# National Violent Death Registry System (NVDRS)

- NVDRS is a data set maintained by SAMS that includes all violent deaths in Nevada.
- Indicators:
  - Violent deaths including suicides, including incident type, toxicology, and circumstances surrounding the incident
- Limitations:
  - Data sets are deidentified
  - Reporting is delayed up to one year or more



# State Unintentional Drug Overdose Reporting System (SUDORS)

 SUDORS is a data set maintained by SAMS that includes all accidental drug overdose deaths and unknown intent.

#### Indicators:

 Unintentional drug overdose deaths by substance, type, and origin of drugs, circumstances surrounding the incident

- Suicides are not included in SUDORS but are included in NVDRS.
- Data sets are deidentified
- Reporting is delayed up to one year or more



# Overdose Reporting

- NRS 441A requires reporting of all overdoses by medical providers within 72 hours of occurrence.
- Indicators:
  - Type of drug, demographics, additional commentary
- Limitations:
  - Not all hospitals report overdoses.
  - Not all patients present as an overdose and will be excluded from the data.
  - Data quality is reliant on what the providers submit.



# State Funded Mental Health Facilities (Avatar)

- Avatar contains data for state funded mental health facilities throughout Nevada.
- Indicators:
  - Clients served at state-funded mental health clinics, services used
- Limitations:
  - Data are representative of Nevada state-operated mental health facilities and are not generalizable to the rest of the population.



# Treatment Episode Data Sets (TEDS)

- TEDS includes client level data for persons who are receiving publicly funded substance use services.
- Indicators:
  - Substance type, mental health, problem gambling
- Limitations:
  - Data quality is reliant on what providers submit to WITS.
     Some providers may submit incomplete records or many "unknown" values.

# Monitoring the Future Survey

 Annual survey that collects substance use data among secondary school students and young adults over a lifetime, past year, and past month

### Indicators:

 Illicit drug use, marijuana/hashish use, amphetamine use, alcohol use, inhalant use, hallucinogen use, cocaine use, vaping

- Office of Analytics does not have access to the raw data.
   It is only available on the Monitoring the Future Survey website.
- Data only available at a national level
- Most current data are from 2019
- Only focuses on substance use



# National Survey on Drug Use and Health

 Annual survey on the use of illicit drugs, alcohol, tobacco, and mental health issues in the United States

### Indicators:

 Illicit drug use, alcohol use disorder, at risk for alcohol or substance use disorder, mental health

- Office of Analytics does not have access to the raw data.
   It is only available on the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Service (SAMHSA) website.
- Data are only available at a statewide level
- Most current data are from 2019



## Nevada Report Card

- Nevada Report Card provides school-related data pertaining to K-12 public education
- Indicators:
  - Habitual truants, graduation percentage, bullying and cyber bullying, suspensions
- Limitations:
  - Office of Analytics does not have access to the raw data. It is only available on the Nevada Report Card website.
  - Data available statewide, by district, or by school



## Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS)

 Bi-annual survey that collects information on health risk behaviors, preventative health practices, chronic health conditions, and use of preventive services among youth

### • Indicators:

 Physical and mental health, depression, suicide attempt, substance use, tobacco use, sexual behaviors, sexual violence, violence, sexual orientation

- Survey is conducted bi-annually
- The University of Nevada, Reno houses the data and Office of Analytics requests the data from them.
