In 1980, I became the first Southern Nevada-based pediatric cardiologist. I am a past Chief of Staff and past Chief of Pediatrics at Sunrise Hospital. I am the Founder and Past President of the Las Vegas Pediatric Society, Past President of the Western Society of Pediatric Cardiology (12 western states) and a member of the Clark County Medical Society, the American Society of Echocardiography, Western Society of Pediatric Research, American Osler Society, and the American Association for the History of Medicine. I am also a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American College of Cardiology.

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I have been a Clinical Professor of Pediatrics with the University of Nevada, Kirk Kerkorian School of Medicine (Las Vegas) since 2017 and was a Professor of Pediatrics with the University of Nevada, School of Medicine (Reno) from 2001-2017. I have published and presented over 240 medical articles and abstracts as well as the self-published, *Simple and Easy Pediatric Cardiology* textbook.
