Clarifying the English Replacement of a Foreign Birth Certificate

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- Clarifying ID requirements for Declarations of Paternity/Parentage
- Clarifying how to fill out the cause of death
- Aligning deadlines for medical certifiers to sign death certificates with existing law
- Clarifying who is responsible to sign a death certificate once the coroner relinquishes jurisdiction
- Clarifying the responsibility of transferring death records from one funeral home to another
- Clarifying gender identity options and the evidence needed to change it once the record has been registered
- Clarified the delayed birth process and evidence required
- Clarified the non-refundable status of fees once services have been rendered
- Removal of the notary services from regulation

The Division is bringing forward this change to clarify regulations as instructed by the Nevada State Legislature's Sunset Committee.
