SYSTEM OF CARE

The Nevada System of Care consists of a broad array of both behavioral health and support services. These services include both home and community-based treatment, as well as out-of-home treatment services that are provided when necessary.

Values

- Family-driven and youth-guided, with the strengths and needs of the child and family determining the types and mix of services and supports provided.
- Culturally and linguistically competent, with agencies, programs, and services that reflect the cultural, racial, ethnic, and linguistic differences of the populations they serve to facilitate access to and utilization of appropriate services and supports.
- Community-based, with the focus of services, as well as the system management, existing within a supportive, adaptable framework of organizations, processes, and relationships at the community level.

CHILDREN'S CLINICAL SERVICES

The Children's Clinical Services provides community-based outpatient, individual and family oriented mental health services for children from 6 through 17 years of age.

EARLY CHILDHOOD MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Early Childhood Mental Health Services provides services to children between birth and eight years of age with emotional disturbance or risk factors for emotional and behavioral disturbances and associated developmental delays. The goal of services is to strengthen parent-child relationships, support the family's capacity to care for their children and to enhance the child's social and emotional functioning.

IN-HOME CLINICAL TEAM

The goal of the In-home Clinical Team is for youth through age 20 with Severe Emotional Disturbances, Severe Emotional Illness in Urban Clark County who are transitioning back to their homes and communities from a higher level, out of home treatment placement or are at risk for out of home treatment placements to have access to intensive, short term in-home clinical and behavioral services to support youth returning to and/or remaining in their homes and community.

MOBILE CRISIS RESPONSE TEAM

The Mobile Crisis Response Team (MCRT) provides immediate, mobile crisis response for assessment, intervention and support to all Nevada youth who are experiencing a mental health or behavioral health crisis. The goal of MCRT is to provide immediate response in order to stabilize and support youth to safely remain in their homes, communities and schools, utilizing a team comprised of a master's level clinician and a bachelor's level psychiatric caseworker to assess, provide short term mental health interventions, safety plan, and link to needed immediate and ongoing services. MCRT Is available to all youth under the age of 18 (18 if still in high school).

WRAPAROUND IN NEVADA

Wraparound In Nevada (WIN) is a statewide, community-based program that offers a tiered care coordination approach to serving children and youth with Severe Emotional Disturbances (SED) and complex behavioral and mental health needs. Using evidence-based and evidence-informed model approaches, the overall goal of WIN is to provide individualized and strength-based support for children, youth, and families in reaching their goals or "family visions" with a decrease in need for higher levels of care, including out of home placements.

PSYCHIATRIC RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT CENTER

PRTFs provide 24-hour highly structured services for children and youth between ages 6-17 who are severely emotionally disturbed. Licensed by the Bureau of Health Care Quality and Compliance (HCQC) and accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), services are provided by Medicaid-credentialed staff.

DESERT WILLOW TREATMENT CENTER

Desert Willow Treatment Center is a 44 -bed psychiatric hospital accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations that provides mental health treatment for children and adolescents aged 6 to 17 years old. The facility is licensed by The Bureau of Health Care Quality and Compliance and is currently licensed for a 12-bed acute psychiatric care unit, an 8-bed pediatric RTC unit servicing 6–11-year-old patients, and two 12-bed RTC units servicing 12–17-year-old patients. DWTC's mission is to promote positive selfgrowth, create change in behavior, attitudes, values, and ways of thinking through education, therapeutic treatment, and appropriate medical and mental health services.
