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



Planning Council Statutory Duties



- 1. Review the block grant plan and make recommendations.
- 2. Advocate for adults with a serious mental illness, children with a serious emotional disturbance, and others with mental illnesses or substance use disorders.
- **3. Monitor, review, and evaluate**, not less than once each year, the allocation and adequacy of behavioral services within the state.



Nevada BHPAC State Authority & Bylaws

<u>Authority</u>: The Nevada State Behavioral Health Planning and Advisory Council (BHPAC) is authorized by **Executive Order of the Governor.**

<u>Mission</u>: The Nevada Behavioral Health Planning and Advisory Council will serve as an advocate for individuals with chronic mental illness, children and youth with severe emotional disturbance, other individuals with mental illnesses or emotional problems, and persons with substance abuse and co-occurring disorders.



Nevada BHPAC Responsibilities



- 1. Advise the Division of Public and Behavioral Health and the Division of Child and Family Services on the development of the state behavioral health plan.
- 2. Serve as an advocate for adults with serious mental illness, children with severe emotional disturbance, other individuals with mental illnesses or emotional problems and persons with substance abuse and co-occurring disorders.
- 3. Monitor, review, and evaluate, no less than once each year, the allocation and adequacy of behavioral health services within the state.

TA for BHPAC - History

December 2015	State requested TA for Council – approved by SAMHSA
January 2016	 Initial TA Goals developed Solidify Council operations (board training, etc.) Address mission, vision, and goals Determine breadth of scope for Council
March 2016	Consultation Calls Initiated
April 2016	Bylaws Updated
June 2016	Plans began for site visit
August 2016	Pre-site visit webinars(2)
September 2016	Site visit planned – not completed
January 2017	Discussions re-initiated with Bureau
November 2017	Bureau Staff requested presentation for Council

Delivery and Details


Variety of Venues - flexibility!

- Conference Calls and Consultation with Key Members
- Virtual Meetings
- Site Visits
- Technology platforms AHP and state

Costs

- Consultant time and travel funded by SAMHSA
- State shares other costs for in-state travel and meeting venues

Time frame – negotiated; based on Council needs and engagement
