## Detoxification Technicians Certification Procedure

Updated: 07/15/2022 SC

1. Applicant applies for detoxification certification through ALiS (<a href="https://nvsapta.aithent.com/LoginSapta.aspx">https://nvsapta.aithent.com/LoginSapta.aspx</a>) – submits payment of \$25.



- 2. Applicant completes paper application for detoxification technician found on the SAPTA certification website: <a href="https://dpbh.nv.gov/Programs/ClinicalSAPTA/dta/Partners/Certification/CertificationHome/">https://dpbh.nv.gov/Programs/ClinicalSAPTA/dta/Partners/Certification/CertificationHome/</a>) and attaches document to ALiS, with high school diploma (or equivalent) and CPR card.
- 3. Provider agency must submit documentation that they've conducted a background check and have deemed this individual eligible to work for their entity. If the individual has a felony, the agency must provide justification for hiring of the individual. Utilize NAC449.822 for list of disqualifying convictions. (See attached criteria).
- 4. Necessary CASAT training/detox technician certificate must be uploaded.
- 5. Certification Lead will work with agencies directly regarding their applications for detox technicians if more information is needed.
