- There were discussions about the sexual assault survivor Bill of Rights, resources, and guides for those survivors. Updates to the Bill of rights shall be given to the Task Force within two weeks and to be presented at the next meeting. Discussions on legal requirements for sexual assault survivors to receive the Bill of Rights.
- 6. For Discussion:** Review and discussion of Bill Draft Request (BDR) 99-9999 which seeks to revise provisions governing the ability of a minor to consent to certain health care services. – Senator Dallas Harris
- No additional discussion was made.
- 7. For Discussion:** Discussion related to HIV prevention services and medications and mandate for all Nevada insurances to cover all preventive services and medications, also requiring all Nevada insurances to cover all HIV prevention medications, as well as treatment for any STI such as syphilis, as pharmacy benefits, not medical benefits. Lastly, also prohibiting co-pay accumulation. – Rob Phoenix, APRN, FNO-C, HIV-PCP
- There were discussions in regard to expanding access to treatment options, coverages for labs and HIV prevention medications. Possible expansion access to Hep C patients as well.
