Outstanding 2025 Goals:

- The OFS will coordinate with the Division of Public and Behavioral Health (DPBH)
 tribal liaisons to get CFS on the agenda for Intertribal Council of Nevada (ITCN)
 meetings to increase awareness of the Council among tribal members.
- 2. Review federal standards or policies that create barriers and food insecurity.
- 3. Subjects/topics related to Food Insecurity Statistics, such as the pounds of food distributed, and people served.
