**3. Presentation on the 2022 proposed regulations for NAC 450B – Emergency Medical Services and the Small Business Impact Statement**

Bobbie Sullivan: Emergency Medical Services program distributed 7,486 Small Business Impact Questionnaires and proposed regulations were posted on the Division's website on June 23, 2022. No questionnaires were returned. The Board of Health will meet on December 2, 2022, and the proposed changes will be presented.

**4. Change to the Proposed regulation after sending out the Small Business Impact Questionnaire Public Comment**

The NAC 450B additions and revision changes clarify the background check process and the types of criminal conviction that make an applicant ineligible for a license.
