The workshop will be conducted in accordance with NRS 241.020, Nevada's Open Meeting Law.

The proposed changes will revise Chapter 457 of the Nevada Administrative Code and NAC 459 and is being proposed in accordance of regulations in LCB File No. R021-18RP3.

The proposed addition/change of regulations will provide for:

- NAC 457 Operation of Radiation Machine for Mammography. Increasing the fee for a mammographer's certificate and establishing a late payment fee; revising certain requirements for digital mammography machines; removing the requirement to provide a notice concerning a patient's breast density from existing regulations;
- NAC 459 Radiation Control. Prescribing the requirements for the operation of invasive intervention radiation machines that are used to perform radiography which is exempt from the requirements of the federal regulations adopted pursuant to the Mammography Quality Standards Act of 1992, as amended; prescribing the qualifications for persons who operate invasive intervention radiation machines to perform such federally exempt radiography; prescribing the fee for obtaining a duplicate registration certificate for a radiation machine or for a person installing, servicing or repairing radiation machines; revising provisions governing a license or registration authorizing the possession and use of radioactive materials; revising provisions governing surveys of areas; revising requirements concerning X-ray systems; specifying requirements concerning linearity for certain devices; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.
