Meeting Dosimetry Regulation Requirements

The Radiation Control Program (RCP) held a very interactive and successful Stakeholders Meeting on June 22, 2016. There was an unprecedented attendance, with open discussion on regulations and guidance.

The RCP has received many comments and questions about the dosimetry forms available for use and the applicability to each.

Licensees and registrants can review Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 459.337, 459.339, 459.3355, and 459.3665 for basic requirements. For annual and lifetime cumulative requirements, review NAC 459.365 and 459.786.
