Topic: List of Approved Installers for Radiation Producing Machines

To: Radiation Producing Machine Registrants and Service Providers

Background: Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 459.150 requires persons who install or perform service on radiation producing machines to be registered by the State of Nevada Radiation Control Program (RCP). Radiation Producing Machine (RPM) registrants are responsible for ensuring their machines are installed, serviced, and/or removed from service by a registered installer or service provider. To assist registrants with determining if a service provider is registered, the RCP maintains a list of installers on its web site at:

The RCP does not endorse, recommend, or encourage the use of one service provider over another. The list is intended to be an aid for registrants to identify if a service provider is registered with the RCP. Since the list is updated periodically, there may be times when a new service provider is not on the list. If a service provider is not listed, registrants should request to see the service provider's registration certificate, or contact the RCP to verify the service provider is registered.

NAC 459 Requirements to use registered service providers

- NAC 459.150(4). No person may repair, maintain, or install radiation machines unless he or she is registered in conformance with the requirement of NAC 459.150 to 459.166, inclusive.
- NAC 459.154(6). Each person who seeks to engage in the business of installing radiation machines, furnishing services, or repairing radiation machines in this State must apply for registration with the Division and receive a certificate of registration before furnishing any services.
